








Cybercrime in Thailand

Legislation

- Computer Crime Act B.E.2550
- production of data: computer data, subscriber information (section 18, section 26)
- punishment: maximum 200,000 baht fine and daily fine of 5,000 baht in
- maximum until the order or the condition is complied with

Legislation

- Computer Crime Act (no.2) B.E.2560
- Expeditious compliance with the request: 7 days (section 18)
- Extension of data retention period: 90 days with the maximum of 2 years; case-by-case basis (section 26)
