

Ms Siobhán Mullally is an Irish national. She is Established Professor of Human Rights Law and Director of the Irish Centre for Human Rights, School of Law, NUI Galway. She is a Commissioner on the Irish Human Rights and Equality Commission, and a member of the Permanent Court of Arbitration in the Hague. She is joint Editor in Chief of the Irish Yearbook of International Law (Hart Publishing: Oxford) and Program Director of the LLM in International Human Rights Law and Public Policy at University College Cork.

She has held lecturing positions in the UK and in Pakistan and has held visiting positions at several universities in the U.S. (Harvard, Columbia, Cornell, Emory and Temple University), at the European University Institute (EUI), Australia (Sydney), Canada (York, Toronto), Pakistan (Peshawar) and India (Bangalore - NLSIU). In 2009- 2010, she was a Fulbright Scholar and Senior Fellow in Residence at Columbia University, School of Law.

She has worked as an adviser and consultant on gender, migration and human rights to UN bodies (UNDP, UNIFEM, OHCHR) and to international NGOs in many parts of the world, including most recently in Ethiopia, Timor-Leste, Kazakhstan, Pakistan and Afghanistan. She served as Chairperson of the Irish Refugee Council from 2006-2008.

She is a member of the Odysseus European network of experts on Asylum and Migration Law and was previously a member of the EU Network of Experts on Free Movement of Persons.

She is a graduate of the European University Institute, Florence (PhD), the London School of Economics (LLM) and University College Cork (BCL). She has published widely in the fields of gender, human rights, asylum and migration law. Her most recent book is: Mullally S.
