











The JMA 2013-2015 highlights

A total of 1411 participants - gender balanced – including participants from vulnerable groups and with fewer opportunities.



A total of 26 capacity-building activities reaching out to almost 1050 multipliers

While the geographical focus of the Action was Europe, peer-learning was indeed global w participants from all five continents



11 activities were implemented in the framework of the Africa-Europe Youth Co-operation and 24 projects were funded under the Africa-Europe seed-funding scheme

The usefulness and appropriateness of the Global Education Guidelines as a pedagogical tool is attested by the total number of downloads of the online versions in different languages from 2013-2015: 66 659 downloads


14 meetings encouraging peer-learning and the sharing of good practices (regional and kick-off seminars) contribute to the implementation of national strategies and action plans and culminated in the 3rd Global Education Congress that put forward a new set of policy recommendations.

2 online platforms/resource centres were created and launched to serve as tools for knowledge exchange, sharing best practices and learning opportunities and collect pedagogical tools: the On-line Resource Centre for Africa-Europe Youth Co-operation (AYECO) and the Global Education Resource Centre.

 From 2013-2015 the Global Education Week reached out to approx. 3900 schools and youth organisations, 18000 teachers/youth trainers, 750 000 pupils/youth


