Objectives

This conference is co-organised by Pompidou Group of the Council of Europe and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Mexico in cooperation with the National Institute for Women (INMUJERES).

The importance of appropriately mainstream gender in drug-related policies and programmes was recognized in the outcome document of the 2016 United Nations General Assembly Special Session on the world drug problem. Therefore, this conference will endeavour to take into account the CND 59/5 resolution on mainstreaming a gender perspective in drug related policies and programmes.

The main objective of the conference is to highlight the importance of mainstreaming a gender perspective in all aspects of drug policies.

In addition, it will analyse the negative impacts and the consequences that women and girls face concerning any aspect of the drug chain, such as the unequal access to health care and social services, the double stigma as drug consumers and because of their expected role in society due to their gender, the diversification of organized crime (trafficking in persons), the role of women in organized crime (the lowest links), the disproportionate criminal sanctions which lead to a vicious cycle of impoverishment, marginalization and crime, as well as the lack of adequate social reintegration programmes according to gender-specificities and the family consequences, especially on children of women deprived of their liberty for drug-related offences.

Within Pompidou Group work programme, this conference is part of the activity "*Introducing gender dimension in drug policies*" and it is the first activity organised in Mexico.
