Pompidou Group



Co-operation group to combat drug abuse and illicit trafficking in drugs

- Partial agreement of the Council of Europe
- Strengthening European co-operation with international drug enforcement bodies
- Form of co-operation allowing the pursuit of certain activities
- Interested member States opt-in to participate through the Partial Agreement
- **39** *member states* + observer states + third countries + international organisations
- Technical co-operation involves close work with the Mediterranean region, Africa, the America's and Asia.



Core mission



- Development of multidisciplinary innovative, effective and <u>Evidence-Based</u> drug policies in its member states
- Has a *Bridging role* both between its member States and non-EU-countries and towards neighbouring countries in the Mediterranean regions and beyond
- Ensures that policy recommendations are consistent with other fields of Council of Europe work with particular emphasis on ethical issues and the respect of *Human Rights/Rule of Law*



Experts on Drug Related Cybercrime from police, customs, border forces, prosecutors, judges international organisations, the private sector, postal services, express mail industry and IT-experts who are already involved in the control, investigation or prosecution of Drug Related Cybercrime or might be involved in this line of work in the near future.

MAIN AIMS

The main goals for the future is to be a platform with a means of contact to all partners in order to increase the network, which is necessary for a rapid exchange of information and best practice to combat new phenomenon through improved control, risk management and profiling. It is necessary to increase the knowledge on detection and investigative measures through risk assessment, awareness raising, exchange of information, sharing of best practices, networking and multidisciplinary cooperation with international organisations, third countries, the private sector and judicial cooperation. Awareness has to been raised on the developments of virtual currencies and concrete policies and legislation have to be developed and adjusted with regard to seizures and confiscation of bitcoins or virtual money.
