Species action plans (SAPs)

- AEWA Preparation of 5 new/revised action and management plans(White-headed Duck, Dalmatian Pelican, Barnacle Goose, Greylag Goose and Velvet Scoter), recommended format for SAPs
- BirdLife International work on LIFE EuroSAP project:
 - 9 out of 16 Action plan currently under finalisation
 - Development of tractking tool for SAPs implementation <u>www.trackingactionplans.org</u>
- Creation of a European Species Coordination Group, to be working as a platform for coordination between the 5 legal frameworks operating on bird conservation – European Union, CMS, Raptors MoU, AEWA and Bern Convention
- Challenges in the implementation of Species Action Plans were discussed
 - link between SAPs and national and local implementation
 - Multispecies Action and Management Plans
 - International coordination



Mandate of the Group of Experts

- Bern Convention is a frontrunner in many issues linked to birds' conservation, later taken on board by other actors
- How to best use the Group of Experts:
 - Catalyst for thinking on new emerging issues,
 - Coordination mechanism for Contracting Parties, feeding into the work of other groups under other instruments, such as Flyways Groups, Energy Working Group, Poisoning Group, Renewables Group, etc.
 - the new mandate and work programme should be more specific on the areas of future work of the Group and, where possible, specific outcomes' oriented.
- Next steps: The Secretariat, in cooperation with the Chair of the Group of Experts, should prepare a revised mandate of the group, accompanied by a draft Framework Programme of Work (FPoW)
- Election of Chair and Vice -Chair
