Participants are invited to discuss the status of signature, ratification or accession by specific countries.

3. Information provided by parties and observers – Tour de table

Participants are invited to present information on legislative developments, major cases, important events, training provided to other countries, including by international organisations etc.

Participants are in particular invited to provide information on initial and continued domestic training for judges and prosecutors.

4. Dialogue with international organisations (T-CY observers)

Representatives of international organisations with observer status in the T-CY are invited to present relevant activities and engage in a dialogue with T-CY members. Observers include the African Union Commission, ENISA, European Union, Interpol, ITU, OAS, OECD, OSCE, UNODC, G8 High-tech Crime Subgroup.

5. Assessment of Articles 31 and related Articles on international cooperation(cont'd): Review of draft report and draft recommendations*

For consideration and decision by the 10^{th} Plenary: Given the relevance of international cooperation provisions, the T-CY Bureau proposes that the Assessment of Article 31 and related Articles be extended and that the final report be only adopted at the 11^{th} Plenary in June 2014.

Based on an updated draft assessment report, T-CY members are invited to provide additional information and to discuss draft conclusions and recommendations.

It is strongly recommended that delegations comprise practitioners responsible for mutual assistance.

6. Transborder access to data*

The Ad-hoc Sub-group on transborder access to data and data flows will present a summary report on its work in 2012-2013 for consideration by the T-CY.

This includes an updated draft Guidance Note # 3 on Transborder Access to Data in view of seeking further comments for consideration in conjunction with the work on the Additional Protocol.

7. T-CY Guidance Notes*

The T-CY is invited to consider draft Guidance Notes in view of their adoption:

Guidance Note # 8 Subscriber information

Parties are invited to make proposals for additional Guidance Notes.

8. T-CY Workplan: review and adoption of the workplan 2014/15*

Parties are invited to consider the draft workplan in view of its adoption.

9. Rules of procedure / statute*

Pending future consideration of a possible Statute, the T-CY is invited to consider draft rules of procedures prepared by the Bureau in view of their adoption.

10. Financial resourcing of the T-CY for 2014-15*

The Secretariat will inform participants on the state of financial resources available for the T-CY in 2014-15.

Following the decision on T-CY financing taken at the 9th Plenary, Parties are invited to consider financial support to the T-CY through voluntary contribution to the CYBERCRIME@OCTOPUS project.

The Secretariat will provide an update of technical cooperation projects and the state of the Council of Europe Programme Office on Cybercrime in Bucharest (C-PROC).
