Data protection

- Art. 8 and 10 ECHR
- Convention 108, opened for signature on 28
 January 1981
- Additional protocol regarding supervisory authorities and transborder data flows, opened to signature on 8 November 2001

Council of Europe

Strengths of Convention 108

- Reference text
- First international legally binding treaty
- Universal basic principles of data protection
- Drafted in a simple, general and technologically-neutral way
- Cross-cutting scope of application covering all data processing in the public and private sector

Strengths of Convention 108

- Provides a high level of protection and free flow of information between the Parties + requirement of ensuring an adequate level of protection for data transfers to noneparties
- Framework for multilateral co-operation through a conventional consultative committee
- Not a purely « European » instrument
- Open to the accession of non-member states of the Council of Europe

Convention ratified by 44 of the 47 Council of Europe members states

 Uruguay will the first non member state acceding to the Convention

Object, purpose and scope

- Respect for rights and fundamental freedoms of individuals, with regard to automatic processing of personal data
- Automated personal data files and automatic processing of personal data in the public and private sectors

Council of Europe



Duties of the parties

- Convention is not self-executing
- Parties shall take the necessary measures to give effect to the provisions of the Convention

Basic principles

- Fairness and lawfullness
- Specified and legitimate purpose
- Data are adequate, relevant and not excessive
- Data are accurate and up to date
- Conservation for no longer than required
- Data security
- Requirement of appropriate safeguards providing in a domestic law to process « sensitive data »

Rights of the data subjects

- Right of access
- Right of rectification or erasure
- Right to have a remedy

Transborder Data flows

- In principle, Free flow of informations between parties
- Transfer to third countries: adequacy principle (additional protocol)

Objectives

- Respond to challenges to privacy related to the use of new technologies
- Reinforce the right to data protection
- Raise the need to reconcile that right with other fundamental rights and freedoms
- Strengthen the implementation and follow up mechanism of the Convention

Convention 108



General orientations

- Maintain general and simple principles
- Maintain technologically neutral provisions
- Ensure consistency and compatibility with the legal framework of the European Union and other international frameworks such as the OECD Guidelines
- Reaffirm and promote the Convention's potential as a universal standard and its open character
- Contribute to assure the free flow of information

Main changes proposed

- Object and purpose: strengthen the right to data protection
- Definitions: update some concepts, for example « automated data files », « automatic processing », « controller of the file »
- Scope: retain its cross-cutting nature, cover all data processings (automated and non automated) - except for household data processing
- Basic principles:
 - incorporate the principle of proportionality and data minimisation
- Lawfulness of data processing (in particular, consent)

Main changes proposed (2)

- Sensitive data: extension of the catalogues, distinction between different qualification of sensitive data
- Data security: obligation to report security breaches,
- Strengthen the rights of data subjects:
 - o Right to be informed on the collection of data
 - Right of access: access to the origin of the data and to the underlying reasoning of the processing be introduced in the catalogue of informations that the data subject could obtain
 - right of opposition
 - o right not to be subject to an automated individual decision
- Introduction of « Data protection » obligations

Main changes proposed (3)

Transborder data flows

- find an effective balance between the free flow of data and a sufficiently high level of protection (adequacy principle)
- International co-operation:
 - strengthen the competence and independence of DPAs
 - strengthen the Consultative Committee's functions and powers

Conclusion

- Modernisation: priority of the CoE
 - T-PD will endorse the draft at its 28th meeting from 19th to 22nd June
 - Ad hoc committee will examine and finalise the proposals (2nd semester 2012)
 - Committee of Ministers should adopt the text in 2013
- Convention should play a fundamental and central role in developing universal data protection rules
- Convention gives third countries which accede to it an opportunity to obtain the recognition of the adequacy of theirs laws
