

MAAWG cooperation against cybercrime

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Messaging & cybercrime



- International industry open consortium since 2004
- 184 member companies worldwide
 - ISPs & webmail providers, vendors, senders, registrars
 - representing ~ 1 billion mailboxes
- Pre-normative and influential
 - not a standards organisation, not a certification body
- Not a lobbying organisation
- Main output: <u>anti-abuse operational best practices</u>
 - recommendations on port 25, botnets, walled gardens, webmail, phishing, ...
 - quarterly: "abusive mail" metrics reports (~ 500 M mailboxes)
 - occasionally: responses to consultations
- Liaisons (APWG, IETF, GSMA, ...)
- Cooperation with authorities
 - member of London Action Plan
 - direct participation of LEA, joint meetings and training seminars
 - creation of MAAWG metrics programme in 2005 (OECD request)
 - ? CoE Global Project on Cybercrime

Messaging & cybercrime



- MAAWG General Meetings
 - 3 every year (one in Europe)
 - Technical: committee work to progress operational best practices, panels on emerging threats, tutorials, alerts, etc
 - Collaborative: exceptional international meeting ground for antiabuse staff

 - with focus on mobile abuse
- GM # 20: Washington DC, 4-6 October 2010
 - with focus on public policy issues
