The European Certificate on Cybercrime and Electronic Evidence- Basic level for Judges, Lawyers and Prosecutors project is an initiative of Cybex, the leading Spanish consultancy firm working on forensic digital services.

The ECCE project is funded by the European Commission's Directorate General Freedom, Security and Justice and Cybex, within the framework of the Criminal Justice 2007 JPEN Programme (JLS/2007/JPEN/218).

The aim of the ECCE project is to create the first European Certificate on the fight against Cybercrime and Electronic Evidence (ECCE). This ECCE project has developed the basic level training course. It is intended for the exclusive use of legal professionals – judges, prosecutors and lawyers - with the purpose of providing them with theoretical and practical skills as well as with legal and technical knowledge in these issues.

The training of legal professionals in the framework of a common European training schedule endeavours to promote better and stronger judicial cooperation on questions related to electronic evidence and cybercrime. The final objective of the ECCE project is indeed to contribute to strengthen a genuine European area of justice on the basis of mutual recognition and trust.

This pioneering programme is the result of the collaboration of a group of multidisciplinary outstanding partners throughout Europe and Latin America.

Academic programme

The Basic level training programme aims at dealing with the principal issues of cybercrime and electronic evidence.

During the 4 days full-time course (each day includes 8 hours of training), the programme will include a comprehensive theoretical and practical approach to these questions with a total of 14 hours dedicated to technical and 11 hours to legal matters.

At the end of the seminar, the legal professionals who will have attended these specialised training courses will have acquired legal and technical knowledge about the following items:

- The introduction and definitions of cybercrime, computer forensics and electronic evidence.
- The international, European and national regulation legislations.
- The different types of offences within cybercrime.
- The seizing and analyzing of electronic evidence.
- The procedural instruments to collect electronic evidence.
- A country situation report about cybercrime, types of offences and the procedural instruments to collect electronic evidence.
- The international cooperation in the seizing of electronic evidence and the European Evidence Warrant.
- The requirements for the admissibility in courts of electronic evidence in Europe.
- The future of cybercrime and the electronic evidence: the related challenges, perspectives and strategies.

Conditions to attend the course

In order to enhance the quality of the training programme as well as the value and recognition of the certificate, the graduation from the European Certificate on Cybercrime and Electronic Evidence training programme is subject to some conditions:

- Assiduity in courses will be a prerequisite for the trainees' successful certification, as they will need to have followed an 80% of the total time of the taught courses in order to obtain the attendance certificate.
- In addition, trainees will be evaluated with case studies and practises throughout the seminar, and will have to submit a final assessment in order to obtain the European Certificate on Cybercrime and Electronic Evidence.
- The courses will be delivered in English. For that reason, trainees must have a proficient English level.
