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The Safer Internet program

Overall aim

"to promote a safer use of the internet and other online technologies, particularly by children, and to fight illegal and harmful content ranging from child abusive images to racism".

The Safer Internet program

Hotlines and awareness-raising

2 Europe-wide networks:

inhope Network of Hotlines to fight illegal content in 24 European countries (+ Asia, Australia, America)

ins@fe Awareness Network in 25 European countries and Helplines to inform and empower children and parents



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Activities related to law enforcement

Hotlines

- Hotlines co-operate with Law Enforcement
- Hotlines do pre-investigative tasks (assess the reported content - identify illegal content)
- Hotlines facilitate efficient Law Enforcement cross-border operations by signposting reports to the country of origin
- In 2007 the European members processed about 110,230 reports. 29,609 reports were forwarded to police agencies




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Activities related to law enforcement

Peer-to-peer networks

- Only few tools exist to help Law Enforcement in fighting p2p paedophile exchanges
- MAPAP (Measurement and Analysis of P2P activity Against Paedophile content) project:
 - design methods and tools to support Law Enforcement dealing with paedophile exchanges
 - provide accurate information on paedophile activity in currently running p2p systems
 - protect users from illegal content




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Activities related to law enforcement

Tools to support police investigations

Development of technological tools which support police investigation, ex.:

- Facilitate analysis of evidence material on seized computers etc.
- Match victims, offenders or details of crime scenes in different pictures or videos
- Facilitate investigations in order to rescue the victims

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Activities related to law enforcement

Co-operation with Interpol

The Commission plans to award a grant to Interpol for the further development and maintaining of the International Child Sexual Exploitation Image Database (ICSEDB).


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Activities related to law enforcement

Research into offenders and victims (1)

Research in online-related sexual abuse of children, in particular online grooming.

The findings will help Law Enforcement (and other target groups) to understand the paedophile activities better.


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Activities related to law enforcement

Research into offenders and victims (2)

POG (Understanding the Process of Online Grooming and victim selection) project - the largest study on online grooming in Europe:

- Describe behaviour of offenders and young people who are 'groomed'
- How is ICT used for online grooming?
- How are young people selected for abuse online?
- Support development of awareness and preventative initiatives
- Contribute to online sex offender risk assessment


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Activities related to law enforcement

CIRCAMP police network

A network to facilitate exchange of information and best practice between Law Enforcement agencies.

Main issues:
Cooperation between Law Enforcement bodies and Internet Service Providers
Cooperation with the banking and credit card sector when investigating in commercialised child sexual abuse image dissemination

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Activities related to law enforcement

Mobile Alliance

The Mobile Alliance against child abuse images, initiated by the Commission is an agreement with leading European mobile operators on protecting minors using mobile phones.

It addresses the danger that broadband networks are misused in the same way as the Internet.

24 mobile operators and content providers covering all 27 Member States and serving 96% of the EU mobile customers involved.

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Activities related to law enforcement
Co-operation with the Russian Federation

The Russian side agrees that respective Law Enforcement agencies should closely cooperate in the field of cyber crime, including online child sexual abuse.

A multi-stakeholder Safer Internet conference is planned to be held in Russia.

2 Russian hotlines established in 2008.

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Filtering and parental tools

For example: the SIP-BENCH project

- Help parents and teachers in choosing filters
- Determine best practices in filtering
- Provide input to the filtering industry
- Track progress of the filtering solutions

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Self-regulation

Initiatives of the European Commission, e.g.:

European framework for safer mobile use by younger teenagers and children

Signed by leading mobile providers and content providers in Brussels on 6 February 2007, initiated by the Commission

Safer Social Networking Principles for the EU

Signed by 18 leading Social Networking companies in Luxembourg on 10 February 2009
