Activity outline

BACKGROUND

The European Union/Council of Europe regional project CyberCrime@IPA started on 1 November 2010 and its launching conference took place on 17-18 February 2011 in Istanbul, Turkey. Countries and areas participating in CyberCrime@IPA are: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Montenegro, Serbia, "the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia", Turkey and Kosovo¹.

The project is implemented by the Council of Europe and it comprises eight expected results.

Expected result 7 is related to the cooperation between the law enforcement agencies (LEA) and Internet service providers (ISP):

Strengthening of co-operation between Law Enforcement Agencies and Internet Service Providers in investigations relating to cybercrime.

It should be noted that the Council of Europe, under the Global Project on Cybercrime, adopted guidelines for LEA/ISP cooperation in April 2008. CyberCrime@IPA will promote the implementation these guidelines in the project areas.²

The approach of the project with regard to LEA/ISP cooperation is as follows:

- Analysis of current cooperation between LEA and ISP in the project countries/areas
- Promotion of cooperation agreements (such as Memoranda of Understanding)
 between LEA and ISPs in each project area
- Training of LEA and ISP staff responsible for cooperation
- Promotion of standard procedures for cooperation

The first regional workshop under this component of the project is scheduled for 9-10 June 2011 in Tirana.
