BACKGROUND

The European Union/Council of Europe Joint Project CyberCrime@IPA (Regional Cooperation in Criminal Justice: Strengthening capacities in the fight against cybercrime) is aimed at strengthening the capacities of criminal justice authorities of Western Balkans and Turkey to cooperate effectively against cybercrime.

The countries/areas covered by the CyberCrime@IPA project are Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Montenegro, Serbia, "The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia", Turkey and Kosovo*.

After 30 months of implementation, the CyberCrime@IPA project is now coming to a close.

The Closing Conference will provide an opportunity for project areas and experts who have contributed to the project to complete the assessment of the progress made, discuss the use of the many tools developed under CyberCrime@IPA and to ensure the sustainability of the project.
