Final shape:

What is a “toolkit”?

*A toolbox (also called **toolkit**, tool chest or workbox) is a box **to organize**, carry, and protect **the owner's tools**. They could be used for trade, a hobby or **Do-It-Yourself**, and their contents **vary with the craft of the owner**.*

Aims and realities

- Guarantee the safety of people in case of disasters
- Means available differ depending on the place in the world where a disaster happens
- Work with what is at hands
- What is at hands *can vary with the craft of the owner.*

Glocalization

- “think globally, act locally”
- Importance of exchanging good practice
- Copy / paste does not work
- Transferability depends on the context

Comparing the comparable

- Looking not only at strategies but also at the context
- Allow for decision makers **living in comparable conditions** to share their respective strategies and to learn from each other
