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Main objective of EUNAD



- EUNAD aims toward the implementation and preparation of EU human rights-related assistance programmes for disabled survivors of disasters.
- EUNAD is a step forward in the implementation of the UN
 Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.

Starting Point 2013 → 2015



Starting point 2013

- Most guidelines show a lack of specialized concepts for practical care, health care and psychosocial support and counseling services for people with disabilities in disaster situations.
- In the literature analysis in total just 38 documents matching the topic 'disability and disaster' were found.

2015 → +++++++++++++++





Literature analysis

In total **38 documents matching the topic exactly** (disability and disaster)

- 6 <u>technical solutions</u> (e.g. alarm/equipment)
- short reports (articles) about local <u>community activities</u> (focusing on people with disabilities) that have been implemented or are being prepared; often as a result of an experience with disaster
- 2 a brief overview of <u>obligatory legal norms</u> applying to the field with reference to the more detailed sources of information (US)
- 4 theoretical scientific papers, chapters, an overview of available literature and other sources
- 4 <u>emergency management research</u> (including people with disabilities) information about projects supported by funds
- 4 scientific reports about research projects, analysis of <u>local circumstances</u>, comparison of crisis management in different parts of the world, recommendations for changes
- 2 scientific overviews of the topic communication with people with different disabilities
- 4 <u>brief practical instructions</u> for communication with people with disabilities
- 1 <u>scientific study of terminology</u> and the possibility of cooperation with people with disabilities
- 1 detailed <u>consensus document</u> an outcome from a conference detailed summary of the key topics
- 2 specific information about <u>victims of crimes with disabilities</u> and the barriers they experience in communication (communication with uniformed)
- 1 paper focusing on problems of <u>shelter workers</u>
- 2 complex <u>training manuals</u> (for helpers)



Results



- ✓ EUNAD recommendations: Crisis Management for sensory impaired people
- ✓ EUNAD Expert Group
- ✓ Intensive Cooperation with the Associations of the disabled
- ✓ Training concepts and training material
- ✓ First empirical results on special psychotraumatology of sensory impaired people





Gaps – Psychosocial Crisis Management



- a knowledge gap on the specific acute reactions and needs of sensory, mentally and physically disabled people in disaster and other potentially traumatic incidents
- a knowledge gap on the specific mid- and long-term trauma related reactions of sensory,
 mentally and physically disabled persons in disaster and other potentially traumatic incidents
- a knowledge gap on psychosocial interventions for disabled people in the acute response as well
 as in the mid- and long-term recovery
- a gap of integrating the needs of disabled people in risk and crisis communication
- Specific training concepts
- educational tools to prepare disabled people to act in as crisis constructive and efficient as possible

There is still a further need to analyse the needs, the gaps, the challenges, and to develop training concepts, educational tools and practical and activity-oriented recommendations.





Task: Research



- Prevalence of traumatic experiences among disabled people
- How disabled people deal with potential threats
- The experience of safety and risk of disabled people in disaster situations
- Needs of people with disabilities
- Coping strategies of disabled people
- Risk of disabled people for being victims of accidents, crimes, violence and other critical incidents
- Posttraumatic stress, depression, social withdrawal and other trauma related disorders among disabled individuals
- Specifics in psychotraumatology of disabled people
- Evaluation of psychosocial interventions (psychosocial acute support, counselling, psychotherapy)

Knowledge will be beneficial to national, regional, and local authorities in preparing and organizing emergency response and may lead to better support for disabled people during and after critical incidents.





Task: Rising Awareness



Preparation and dissemination of information concerning the needs and demands of people with disabilities in disaster situations and the need for special solutions in preparedness and response

- Civil protection authorities
- Organisations of danger defence / uniformed services (fire brigade, rescue services, police)
- NGO's
- Physicians
- Psychosocial acute helpers (e.g. pastoral emergency care, crisis intervention teams)
- Social worker
- Psychological crisis intervention teams for schools
- Mental health professionals

Task: Guidelines



Guidelines have to include the needs of and solutions for people with disabilities

Warning

Risk and Crisis Communication

Information

Evacuation

Architectural issues (e.g. shelters, assistance centers)

Psychosocial Support (acute, mid- and long-term term)





Task: Training



- Development of training concepts and extension of existing concepts for different vocational groups
- Integration of the topics in the regular curricula

- Organisations of danger defence/uniformed services (fire brigade, rescue services, police), NGO's
- Physicians
- Psychosocial acute helpers (e.g. pastoral emergency care, crisis intervention teams)
- Emergency psychologists
- Social worker
- Psychological crisis intervention teams for schools
- Mental health professionals
- Special education teacher





Task: Education



Development of educational toolkits which can be used at schools for disabled children and youths to improve their preparedness and self-help competences in emergency situations and to promote resilience. Contents are e.g.

- How to orientate in chaotic, stressful critical incidents and disaster (e.g. understand visual and hearing impressions)
- How to communicate with uniformed services, physicians and other helpers
- Improve the understanding of the tasks of uniformed services
