"Skills for promoting social cohesion, valuing diversity and handling differences and conflicts".

- * Identifying best practices;
- Determining the most effective teaching methods;
- Raising awareness amongst professionals and the general public

The Main Forms of Cooperation:

- Meetings of national coordinators and specialists,
- Exchange of views and materials,
- Discussion regarding interim results,
- Country visits to share learning experiences



The Main Forms of Cooperation:

- Joint work on the script of the documentary;
- Study of expert opinion on the Project;
- Involvement of government and social structures.





First Part of the Project

- Survey (on the topic of Article 13 of the Charter)
 - Questionnaire consisting of 12 questions;
 - Involving 5 target groups:
- Government employees (Department of Education);
- School directors and teachers;
- Employees of NGOs/Non-profit organisations;
- Learners/Students.

In all 4 countries the educational approaches are:

- Humanistic,
- Axiological (evaluating values),
- Student-centered,
- Competence-based,
- Socio-cultural.

Educational methods being used:

- Interactive education and training methods;
- Project activities;
- Cooperation in the field of technology;
- Work in creative groups;

Educational methods being used:

- Development of pupil autonomy;
- Support of children's initiatives;
- Organisation of social practices;
- Thematic trainings;
- Gaming technologies;
- Promotion of critical thinking.



In all countries, the project receives

Government support.



In Belarus- Youth radio Station "PILOT-FM" features educational programs, youth news, talk shows, specialised programs on education for democratic citizenship, protection and realisation of the rights of children and youth.

The Russian Federation has implemented a "network model" of professional development for teachers. The main component of this model is a course on education

for democratic citizenship for children and youth.





In Lithuania, state support is provided through social and iical services, who

psychological services, who are there to solve children and youth conflicts.

In Georgia, the government provides methodological support for teaching in the

school community.



In all countries, the project also received the support of civil society organisations.

In the Russian Federation, there is the project
"Seven
Competencies of a Citizen"



In Lithuania, the nongovernmental sector has

received state
funding for this
project in the
education system.



In Georgia, new initiatives in school life are being supported, such as "The Role of ICT and the Media".



In all countries, the following similar projects are being implemented:

«Peer teaching a peer» (Belarus),

«Peer to peer» (Russian Federation),

«School network»

(Georgia).

The most important conclusion is that teaching the basics of democracy becomes much more effective when children feel that they are playing an important role in the

learning/teaching process.

Second Part of the Project The Film

In each country an area of discrimination is identified — ranging from inclusive to religious and ethnic issues.

Film's main objective: to show the effective methods that are in place to solve the existing problems, taking into account the specifics of each type of discrimination and the different national education systems.

The Film:

Belarus – Techniques of peer education through the process of dialogue;

Lithuania – Social integration of people with disabilities;

Georgia – Linguistic clubs, volunteer trainers;

Russian Federation — "Mediation" techniques in schools, dialogue in the presence of a third party.

Dissemination of Materials obtained from this Pilot Project:

- Can be used in participating countries to resolve their own specific problems (screening of the documentary film, distribution of materials, workshops and trainings organised);
- Stimulating the government authorities of the participating countries to address more actively the problems presented in the Pilot Project;

Dissemination of Materials obtained from this Pilot Project:

- Experience sharing: useful for other member states of the Council for addressing their specific problems (Publication of materials, international conference on the subject matter);
- Foundation for further work in this area. For example, increasing pubic-private partnerships.
