Capacity building workshop on cybercrime

Colombo, Sri Lanka, 4-5 October 2013

Organised by the ICT agency of Sri Lanka in cooperation with the Council of Europe

Objective

Countries of South Asia – such as Sri Lanka and India – have adopted comprehensive legislation on cybercrime and electronic evidence, and others – such as the Maldives and Pakistan – are in the process of preparing legislation. With this, new challenges arise, including the ability of law enforcement officers, prosecutors and judges to apply such laws in practice.

The Council of Europe has developed a number of concepts and materials that may help Sri Lanka and other countries strengthen the capacities of their criminal justice authorities, including:

- Electronic evidence guide (for law enforcement, prosecutors, judges)
- 1st responders training pack (for law enforcement)
- Basic judicial training course (for prosecutors and judges)
- Advanced judicial training course (for prosecutors and judges)

The purpose of the workshop is to make these training materials available to institutions in Sri Lanka and other countries of the region so that they can incorporate them into their training programmes. The workshop is thus primarily aimed at law enforcement, prosecutors and judges and in particular representatives of judicial and law enforcement training institutions.

As cybercrime and electronic evidence require extensive international cooperation, the workshop will include a round table discussion for decision-makers on the benefits of the Budapest Convention on Cybercrime.
