

1. Organisation of the 2013 survey

- Indicators included in the 2013 survey
 - Language tests prior to entry
 - Optional/compulsory integration programme
 - Optional/compulsory official language classes
 - Use of CEFR proficiency levels to define requirements
 - Cost to migrants
 - Sanctions for non-attendance or low attendance at language courses
 - Quality of courses
 - Optional/compulsory knowledge-of-society course
 - Optional/compulsory testing of language proficiency and knowledge of host society
 - Cost to candidates
 - Sanctions if test not taken or failed
 - Course curriculum
 - Is the effectiveness of programs measured?




Administrative background of officials who completed the 2013 survey



 Number of countries participating in the 2013 survey, that reported language requirements for entry, residence, citizenship





 Number of countries participating in the 2013 survey that reported language requirements for residence





 Language requirements for residence and providing language courses (obligatory and optional attendance)




5. Language requirements for citizenship

 Number of participating countries with language requirements for citizenship





 Number of participating countries with language requirements for residence and/or citizenship




DEVELOPMENTS BETWEEN 2009 – 2013 (27 COUNTRIES)




