The right of children to be protected against sexual violence Relevant case-law

Introduction

While preparing the questionnaires to be addressed to the Parties of the Lanzarote Convention to (1) take stock of the implementation of the Lanzarote Convention and to (2) carry out the first monitoring round of the implementation of the Lanzarote Convention in States Parties,¹ the Lanzarote Committee agreed to address to the Parties a non-exhaustive summary of the Council of Europe² case-law concerning the right of children to be protected against sexual violence.³

The aim of this document is therefore to briefly introduce the relevant case-law of the European Court of Human Rights⁴ and of the European Committee of Social Rights.⁵ This case-law is in fact the natural framework of reference for the Lanzarote Committee as the Parties to the Lanzarote Convention are also all Parties to the two main Council of Europe human rights treaties, the European Convention on Human Rights and the European Social Charter.

The non-exhaustive summary below is up-dated until 2011 included.
