


Launched in 2006 in Monaco to enhance the Council of Europe's commitment to children, the programme "Building a Europe for and with children" has a clear vision: making children's rights a reality for all children in Europe. But how can we turn this vision into reality? The purpose of this conference is to find answers to this question.

This conference will pursue two objectives: first, to evaluate the progress made at national and European levels under the last strategy, launched in Stockholm in 2008 and second, to discuss the main elements of the next Council of Europe Strategy for the Rights of the Child. The main focus of this strategy will be the implementation of existing children's rights standards. This is why this conference focuses specifically on the monitoring of children's rights standards and on partnerships and co-operation. In addition, three topical themes will be addressed in depth: the protection of children's data on the Internet, the empowerment of children through education and support to parents and families

For the Council of Europe it is essential that children are involved in its work on children's rights. Some children are participating in the conference directly, but literally thousands of children took part "behind the scenes" in projects feeding into the preparation of the conference and the new Council of Europe Strategy for the Rights of the Child. 

# Making children the masters of the game: data protection and the new media environment

Children grow up and live with digital screens. This new media environment provides children with many opportunities to learn, express themselves and influence decision making. Yet this environment is also a space where children are at risk of having their rights violated. This workshop aims to explore a range of situations where children's right to private life and data protection are at stake. Participants will discuss measures to enhance children's data protection, starting from the minimum age requirement (consent) and its concrete implementation. The issue of data conservation and the need to remove traces of children's identities on the Internet, as well as the abusive use of children's data will also be addressed.

# Empowering children through learning: democratic citizenship and human rights education

The Council of Europe Charter on Education for Democratic Citizenship and Human Rights Education emphasises the importance of "not just equipping learners with knowledge, understanding and skills, but also empowering them with the readiness to take action in society in the defence and promotion of human rights, democracy and the rule of law". Such empowering requires in-depth change in educational policy and practice involving decision makers, education professionals, civil society and youth organisations. The aim of the workshop is to explore: a) how to raise awareness on the Charter among experts and professionals in the fields of children's rights and education and children themselves; and b) how children can be involved in the implementation of the Charter at school and at local level.
