Examination of national reports for Conclusions 2013 of the Charter and Conclusions XX-2 (2013) of the 1961 Charter

The Committee submitted its conclusions in respect of 38 States Parties in January 2014. It will now examine the reports of the following countries which submitted their reports too late: Azerbaijan, Croatia, Iceland and Luxembourg.

The examination of the report of Portugal is postponed to the next session.

Examination of national reports for Conclusions 2014 of the Charter and Conclusions XX-3(2014) of the 1961 Charter

The Committee will start its examination of country reports submitted for the current reporting cycle covering Charter provisions relating to labour rights.

Its conclusions should be adopted in December 2014 and published in January 2015.

Meetings on non-accepted provisions of the Charter

The Committee will continue the preparation of meetings and/or written procedure in respect of the following countries which are on the agenda of the current session and are concerned in 2014 : Andorra, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belgium, France, Hungary, Italy, Romania, Russian Federation, Serbia, Slovak Republic, Slovenia.
