Questions and Answers concerning Article 14 § 1 in respect of the 26th report of Austria

Preliminary remark: in this paper the term "social services" is only referred to services for elderly and disabled persons.

1. What is the total number of staff providing social services in the Länder?

The Long-Term Care (LTC) sector is a very dynamic sector of the labour market. The Federal Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Consumer Protection estimates the number of employed persons in services for elderly and disabled persons around **80.000**:

- 82 % of them are women
- From 2003 to 2006 there was an increase of 12 %
- There is a clear trend to higher qualifications
- 2. What is the total expenditure on social services in the Länder and in Austria as a whole?

The provision of long-term care and support for elderly persons and persons with disabilities has become a key concern of Austria's social policy. Due to an agreement pursuant to **Article 15a of the Federal Constitution Act between the Federal Repu-blic of Austria and the Länder on joint measures for persons with care require-ments** (Federal Law Gazette No. 866/1993), the range of social services is widened in all Länder.

The "Austrian Report on Long-Term Care" for 2007 shows an expenditure on social services (provincial responsibility) of 1,7 billions €.

3. What is the type of social services frequently requested by users? What is the category of users who mostly ask for these services?

There are three main categories of social services for elderly persons and persons with disabilities:

- ambulant services (e.g. home help and home nursing; more than 100.000 users)
- residential services (about 70.000 inhabitants of nursing homes; for institutions for persons with disabilities the number is unknown)
- semi-residential services (daycare).

In general, priority is given to the strengthening of outreach services and semi-institu-tional care over institutional care. By establishing new care structures, the strain on the care-giving family members has to be eased.
