



### Statics of Korea's MLA






### Statics of MLA between Korea and EU countries

### Scope & Restriction

#### **❖Scope of MLA**

- Investigation on whereabouts of a person or object
- Presentation of documents and records Service of documents
- Gathering of evidence, seizure, search & verification
- Hearing of statements and other measures to make any person testify or cooperate with the investigation in the requesting country

#### **❖**Restriction on MLA

- Where it is deemed that the crime under mutual assistance is one of a political nature, or the request for mutual assistance is made for the purpose of an investigation or trial on another crime of a political nature.
- Where it may be detrimental to the Republic of Korea's sovereignty, national security, public peace and order, or public morals
- Where the crime under mutual assistance does not constitute a crime, or it is a crime against which no public action may be instituted, under the Act of the Republic of Korea



### MLA Procedure

#### **Receiving Letter**

- Through a diplomatic channel or by **direct email**
- Central authority of MLA: KMOJ



#### **Ordering**

KMOJ orders the District Prosecutors' Office to proceed



#### **Proceeding MLA**

District Prosecutors' office proceeds with MLA



#### Sending a Reply

To the requesting country



#### Reviewing

KMOJ reviews the results



#### **Sending Results**

To KMOJ

#### **Direct Mail**

- •U.S, Canada, Japan, Hong Kong, Australia
- Delivery takes approximately 3 days on average



## CASE(1) - Korea's requesting

- Transfer of A Person in Custody for Testimony
  - Morean court needed a testimony from a convict in Japan.
  - This is a first case between Korean that involved a transfer of a convict for the testimony.
    - KMOJ inquired JMOJ on whether such request can be processed.
    - JMOJ sounded out the convict's intention to testify.
    - Continual contact through an attache

## CASE(2) -Requesting to Korea

- > Examination of Witnesses in Korea's Court
  - A Korean suspect, who had no ability to raise capital for business, signed a contract with a city government in Germany. In this process, the suspect swindled the funds and offered civil servants bribes.
  - Germany requested a Korean judge to interrogate witnesses at the Korean court and to send the records of witness interrogation to Germany thereafter.
  - German judges, prosecutors and lawyers attended the interrogation and had an opportunity to question witnesses through Korean prosecutors and judges.







## CASE(3) -Requesting to Korea

- ➤ Hearing by Video Conference
  - Facts of Crime
    - On November 3, 2009, in Costa Rica, a Korean victim (female, age 6) was killed by a car driven by a Canadian woman.
    - The Costa Rican court requested for hearing of statements of victim's family in Korea by video conference.
    - The Korean prosecution service carried out the MLA by installing a temporary video conference system.

## CASE(3) -Requesting to Korea

#### Significance

- During the video trial, the Defendant, who continued to deny her allegations, confessed her wrongdoings and apologized.
- The case was settled successfully between the Costa Rican Prosecutor and the Defendant. They agreed on 3-year imprisonment (suspension of execution for 3 years) and settlement money (USD 20,000) to be given to the family.
- Although there was no MLAT between two countries, MLA was implemented based on the principle of reciprocity.



#### **BASIS OF MLA**

- Not signed the 2nd additional protocol that provides restitution
- MLA based on the principle of reciprocity
- MLA procedures provided in the domestic law

#### **Asset Recovery in Korea**

- Criminal Proceeds Confiscation Center established at the Supreme Prosecutors' Office and each District Prosecutors' office.
- Types of Confiscation
  - Korea allows only criminal confiscation but now promotes to introduce Non-Conviction Based Asset Forfeiture.
  - Confiscation preservation order& collection preservation order also allowed.



### **MLA in Asset Recovery**

- Case(1) Korea's request
  - Fact of Crime
  - The defendant established and operated an illegal casino that stimulates the inclination to gambling so as to earn criminal proceeds in the amount of KRW 4,600,000,000. He had KRW 1,700,000,000 flowed into Mongolia to be used for building a hotel, etc., thereby concealing such criminal proceeds.


