WHY?

The Court seems to be becoming **SCUNNERED**.

It was never meant to be a primary remedy. Article 13 stresses need for "*effective remedy before a national authority*".

SUBSIDIARITY PILOT JUDGMENTS In any event:

IT IS NOT A GOOD IDEA TO WASH YOUR DIRTY LINEN IN PUBLIC

SETTING UP EFFECTIVE REMEDIES

GET THE DOMESTIC LAW RIGHT: it must harmonise with Court judgments.

2. ENFORCE THE LAW

(a)Proper recruitment, training and management of professional prison staff.

- with security of employment
- continuous professional development
- proper conditions of employment
- promotion by merit

(b) Ensure that all discretionary decisions are taken in a transparent and accountable manner in accordance with published criteria.

All actions restricting human rights need to comply with the traditional **PLANN** acronym: they must be Proportionate, Lawful, Accountable, Necessary and Nondiscriminatory

(c) Develop an effective system of internal controls

- within each establishment
- within each region
- within the Headquarters/Ministry

- (d) Develop effective external controls. To be effective, such controls need to be:
- Independent
- Experienced
- Properly resourced
- Entitled to full access
- Accessible and pro-active
- Speedy
- Effective communicators of decisions
- Respected by the Authorities

WHAT KIND OF BODY?

- Prosecutors
- Specialist Judges
- Ombudsman (+)
- Prisons Inspectorates (National Preventative Mechanisms)
- THE COURTS

THE COURTS

- Ultimate domestic remedy
- Also need to be accessible, speedy, able to conduct a comprehensive review of evidence
- Must have effective preventive orders available – interdict, declarator, specific performance
- Must be able to supervise
 enforcement
