					<ul> <li>meeting are:</li> <li>Very open and lively discussions were held regarding terms and definitions already included in the draft glossary and thesaurus, suggestions for further topics, definition of the scope and the extent of the glossary and thesaurus, number of terms and sources for definitions.</li> <li>Following the discussions, it was agreed that in terms of definitions it should be taken advantage of what is already existent and that there is a need for both succinct and more descriptive definitions. The need to make reference to authoritative sources such as UN, CEDAW, EC, Council of Europe and the OXFAM dictionary was also mentioned.</li> <li>Discussions were held regarding the process for validation of the concepts as well as the necessity to link the glossary with gender statistics and with the gender equality index.</li> <li>A new draft of the glossary and thesaurus will be ready for comments by the end of April 2015.</li> </ul>
