**2nd meeting, 6-7 October 2014
(Strasbourg, Palais de l'Europe, Room 6)**

Meeting Report

1. The Committee of Experts on protection of journalism and safety of journalists (MSI-JO) met in Strasbourg on 6 and 7 October 2014. The meeting was opened by Mr Jan Kleijssen, Director, Information Society and Action against Crime Directorate. He provided information on developments in the field of the protection of journalists since the first meeting of MSI-JO and encouraged members to continue their result oriented approach when elaborating the guidelines.
2. In the absence of its Chair, Ms Françoise Tulkens, the meeting was chaired by MSI-JO Vice-Chair, Trond Idås.
3. The Committee adopted the agenda (Appendix II).

Main focus of the meeting

The main focus of the 2nd MSI-JO meeting was the discussion paper Elements for Preamble drafted by the Rapporteur Tarlach McGonagle (see in Appendix II).

Working methods and the structure of the draft Recommendation

The Expert Committee chose to discuss the text section by section.

The MSI-JO discussed in detail the discussion paper, as well as how to transfer it into a complete draft CM Recommendation.

The MSI-JO also discussed the outline structure that the Rapporteur had prepared overnight according to the discussions and the agreements reached on the first day. The committee also discussed on the general scope and headlines for the concrete guidelines.

The proposed structure would be as follows; 1) Preamble, 2) Operative part, 3) Principles, 4) [concrete] Recommendations (or Guidelines), and 5) Appendices.

The Expert Committee identified five points for the operative part.

The concrete recommendations (or guidelines) would be structured under four main parts: prevention, protection, prosecution and promotion of best practices.

Decisions on timelines and follow-up

The MSI-JO will hold its next meeting in Strasbourg from 19 to 20 March 2015. These dates were decided among the MSI-JO members after the meeting via e-mail.

The MSI-JO decided that the Rapporteur Tarlach McGonagle will prepare a preliminary version of the draft recommendation. Thereafter the Secretariat will send the preliminary draft recommendation to the MSI-JO with a deadline of a few days allowing for major comments. The draft will then be transmitted to the CDMSI, if possible before their next plenary meeting (18 – 21 November 2014). MSI-JO members who are also CDMSI members, together with the secretariat, will present the work of the expert committee to the mother committee.

Any other business

The MSI-JO took note of information, suggestions and recommendations provided by representatives from EU (Mr Gabriele Bertolli, EC), OSCE (Mr Juan Barata), UNESCO (Mr Ming Kuok Lim) and Reporters without Borders (Ms Prisca Orsonneau).

The Russian Federation submitted a declaration, in the same spirit as their reservation on the *CM declaration on the protection of journalism and safety of journalists and other media actors (30 April 2014)* (footnote n°1). The Committee took note of the declaration of the Russian Federation and decided to discuss it at its next meeting.
