REPORT

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Item 1 of the agenda: Opening of the meeting

1. Opening the meeting, the Secretariat welcomed the participants and reminded them that as the terms of office of the Chair and the Vice-Chair of the MC-S-PSB had expired at the end of 2005, the Group needed to elect its Chair and Vice-Chair for 2006.

Item 2 of the agenda: Adoption of the agenda

2. The list of participants is set out in Appendix I. The agenda, as adopted, is set out in Appendix II.

<u>Item 3 of the agenda:</u> Examination of how the public service remit should be developed and adapted to suit the new digital environment

3. The Group discussed in more detail how the public service remit should be developed and adapted to the new digital environment. There was wide agreement among the Group that the new instrument or policy paper on the subject should take the form of a Committee of Ministers recommendation to member states; a recommendation would be more usable than, for example, a declaration or a report and would be more in line with the objective of encouraging member states to take concrete action to promote the public service remit in the information society.

4. The Group agreed to examine a preliminary draft Recommendation on the public service remit in the information society prepared by the Secretariat, based on various points in Mr Christian Nissen's report, "Public service media in the information society", and on contributions by MC-S-PSB members and other material concerning the public service remit. In preparing the draft, account was also taken of Parliamentary Assembly Recommendation 1641 to the Committee of Ministers on public service broadcasting and with the MC-S-PSB's terms of reference.

5. The Group discussed the emphasis, content and structure of the preliminary draft Recommendation. It was agreed that the focus of the document should be on strategies for adapting the public service remit rather than on concrete tactical methods (technical, legal, financial, organisational or other), which were an internal matter for the member states.

6. With regard to the structure of the preliminary draft Recommendation, a number of experts suggested keeping all the elements from the report as being important to the content of the Recommendation. Others took the view that the final sections, concerning technical, legal and financial aspects of the question and possible organisational models for public service media might pose problems and should be shortened or relocated in the text, or even left out.

An ad hoc working group was set up to prepare a new version of those sections by the end of June.

7. With regard to the rest of the text, a number of comments were made on such matters as: what specific elements were basic to the public service remit and needed to be addressed in the Recommendation; the meaning of the term "public service media" as compared with "public service broadcasting"; and the public service's contribution to cultural diversity/identity and to preserving the cultural heritage by digitisation of archives.

8. It was agreed that any further comments on the text or suggested wordings should be sent to the Secretariat after the meeting. On the basis of any such comments or proposals, the Secretariat, in co-operation with the Chair, would amend the text and put forward a revised version for the Group's next meeting, including the sections being worked on by the abovementioned ad hoc working group. A revised draft should be circulated for further comment to all MC-S-PSB members in September 2006, with the objective of discussing and agreeing to a text at the next meeting of the group and transmission to the CDMC in time for its November 2006 meeting.

<u>Item 4 of the agenda</u>: Monitoring of implementation by member states of Recommendation No. R (96) 10 on the guarantee of the independence of public service broadcasting

9. The Secretariat informed the Group that some additional replies to the questionnaire on the state of implementation by member states of Recommendation No. R (96) 10 from both member states and independent experts had been received since the Group's previous meeting. An updated version of the document containing the replies had been prepared for the present meeting.

10. On the basis of the consolidated replies and other available sources, such as the 2005 report by the Open Society Institute, Budapest ("Television across Europe: regulation, policy and independence"), or the 2005 UNESCO report ("Public service broadcasting: a best practices sourcebook"), the Secretariat had prepared a preliminary draft information document on the problems of institutional autonomy and editorial independence which public service broadcasters encountered in some member states.

11. The Secretariat likewise presented a preliminary draft Committee of Ministers Declaration on guaranteeing the independence of public service broadcasting. In essence, the document would reaffirm commitment to the principle of independence of public service broadcasting organisations in member states and call on member states to implement, if they had not already done so, the guidelines set out in Recommendation No. R (96) 10.

12. The Group members considered the documents in question and provided guidance to the Secretariat as to how to develop them. In particular, it was agreed to add information about the favourable situation or positive developments in certain member states.

It was agreed that a revised version of the draft Declaration and information document be circulated to MC-S-PSB members for further comments and/or approval by with a view to finalising the draft for transmission to the CDMC in good time for its May-June 2006 meeting.

Item 5 of the agenda: Examination of the role of public service broadcasters in promoting wider democratic participation by individuals with the help of new interactive technologies

13. The Group noted that, at the present stage, there was no need to produce a separate document on public service broadcasters' role in promoting wider democratic participation by individuals with the help of new interactive technologies as the question had already been covered in a sub-section of the preliminary draft Recommendation (cf. paragraph ... below). It

was agreed that further consideration could be given to the question at a later stage, depending on the information available and the objectives which were set for the Group's future work.

Item 6 of the agenda:Decisions of the Steering Committee on the Media and
New Communication Services (CDMC) of interest to
the MC-S-PSB

14. The Group took note of the relevant decision of the CDMC as set out in the extract of the Steering Committee's report on its 2nd meeting (29 November to 2 December 2005) prepared by the Secretariat.

Item 7 of the agenda: Election of the Chair and the Vice-Chair for 2006

15. Mr Gian-Luca Marsella (Switzerland) was unanimously re-elected Vice-Chair for one year. In the absence of candidates for the chair, Ms Bissera Zankova (Bulgaria) was asked by consensus to Chair the present meeting.

Item 8 of the agenda: Other business

16. No matters were raised under this item.

Item 9 of the agenda: Date of the next meeting

17. At the express request of the EBU representatives, who had a problem concerning the scheduled dates of the next MC-S-PSB meeting (19 and 20 October 2006), the Secretariat suggested bringing the meeting forward to 17 and 18 October. The Group agreed to the proposed dates.
