In this capacity, she drafted anti-trafficking policies and designed and implemented related projects in numerous countries, including Azerbaijan, Georgia, Ukraine, the Republic of Moldova, Belarus, Russian Federation, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Poland, Ireland, United Kingdom, France, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan and Turkmenistan. Ms Braşoveanu has also conducted assessments of existing anti-trafficking frameworks and National Referral Mechanisms in the countries mentioned above.

Ms Braşoveanu currently remains active in the field of combating trafficking in human beings as a free-lancer. Recent activities included in-country anti-trafficking assessments for the OSCE and the UNODC/UNFPA in the Republic of Moldova, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan.
