Ms Kateryna Levchenko is a Ukrainian national. She has been President of the International Women's Rights Centre "La Strada-Ukraine" since 1998. She is also Coordinator of the All-Ukrainian Network Against Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children and is involved in the work of a number of governmental and non-governmental organisations, including the International Renaissance Foundation (Soros Foundation), the Association of Ukrainian Human Rights Monitors on Law Enforcement, and the Ukrainian Ombudsman on Child Rights.

In 2006-2007, Ms Levchenko was member of the Ukrainian Parliament, as well as member of the Parliamentary Assembly of the OSCE. She served as Advisor to the Minister of Internal Affairs of Ukraine on Human Rights and Gender Issues in 2004-2006 and 2008-2010.

She has been an activist in women's and human rights movements since the early 1990s and has been involved as member or expert in the work of various international organisations (Council of Europe, OSCE, IOM, UNICEF, UNDP, ILO, etc.).

Ms Levchenko's qualifications include a PhD in philosophy and a degree in law. Her studies cover a wide-range of subjects related to protecting and promoting human rights: women's rights protection, combating trafficking in people, especially women and children, juvenile justice, promotion of gender equality, children's rights protection, prevention of gender-based violence, etc.

She is the author of over 200 books and articles.
