

Mr Helmut Sax is an Austrian national. He studied law at the University of Vienna, and he is currently leading the Child Rights/Women's Rights/Anti-Trafficking team at the Ludwig Boltzmann Institute of Human Rights in Vienna.

Mr Sax has sound academic expertise with an extensive human rights background; he is a member of the Working Group on trafficking of children of the Austrian Task Force against Human Trafficking and has worked for several years in the field of anti-trafficking standards and national and European practice, with particular emphasis on establishment of national referral mechanisms and child rights-based approaches. Recent publications include a Sociological Research Handbook on Child Trafficking (with Tamas/Unterlerchner/Winkler et al, 2009) and the EU Fundamental Rights Agency Study (with Stalford et al., 2009) on developing indicators for the protection, respect and promotion of the rights of the child in the European Union.

Mr Sax is well experienced in monitoring activities and collaboration with non-governmental networks (former acting chair of the European Children's Network; Austrian Child Rights Coalition) and organisations (ECPAT Austria, Ethics Board of the Austrian League for Child and Youth Health).
