

Mr Mihai Șerban is a Romanian national. He holds a Degree in Psychology and Sociology, and a MSc in Prevention and Combating of Drug use. He is accredited by the Romanian National College of Psychologists and has 13 years of practice as a clinical psychologist.

Since 2007, he has been working as Senior Expert in the Romanian National Agency against Trafficking in Persons in the Ministry of Internal Affairs. In this capacity, he provides expertise on policy making, assesses laws and regulations, drafts reports and monitors the activities of governmental institutions and NGOs. He also acts as consultant for the Inter-ministerial Working Group on Prevention and Combating Trafficking in Human Beings and is a member of the National Steering Committee on Prevention and Elimination of Child Labour and the National Steering Committee for Prevention and Combating Child Trafficking. He monitors the implementation of National Identification and Referral Mechanism and co-ordinates the victim's repatriation and social reintegration programme and victim witness co-ordination programme. Further, he is training co-ordinator, trainer and expert within numerous European projects.

Mr Șerban previously worked as Executive Director, Project Manager and trainer for Romanian NGOs. He set up and co-ordinated a Counselling and Therapy Centre for Abused Children within the International Foundation for Child and Family.

He has also acted as expert, researcher, trainer or project manager/evaluator for various EU and UN agencies, governments and NGOs.
