## Spotlight

The **World Forum for Democracy 2016** will take place on **7-9 November 2016** in Strasbourg, France. The Forum will focus on **how education can help bridge the social divide and become a real asset for our diverse democracies**.

The Forum will analyse the impact of education systems on democracy and identify innovative initiatives and practices which can make education (both formal and non-formal) more democracy-centred, and critically assess their potential to trigger systemic change. It will focus on the issue of how education can become better at nurturing citizens as active members of society who engage in public space – and how grassroots innovation can be enhanced to promote change in education practice on a greater scale. The Forum will discuss not only what Education can do for Democracy but also what Democracy can do for Education.

The **call for lab submissions** will be published in **March 2016**.

#### Hackathon Results

The Forum's Democracy Innovation Hackathon aimed at developing a participatory democracy incubator with the purpose to implement democracy innovations at the local level in order to accelerate their growth and success. The hackathon gathered Forum alumni and local political decision-makers to develop the framework of the incubator, while brainstorming on concrete solutions for increasing the impact and reach of democracy innovations, in order to improve citizen participation at the local level. As a result of the incubator, the first democracy innovations are now being implemented in the participating cities. The city of Gent, for example, will use a citizens jury to decide about a new law on traffic circulation in the city.

## Children's Forum



On 3 March 2016, the Council of Europe hosted in its hemicycle the Children's Forum, an event part of the World Forum for Democracy. 1200 students from 45 primary schools of Alsace region, France, who took part in a civic education project run by the Alsatian Themis Association, came to present their proposals for enhancing democracy and human rights. Recognising the importance of educating children for democracy from the early ages, the Council of Europe offered to them a space to express themselves, to participate, to learn voting as the parliamentarians do, to cast their vote, to learn and ask questions about their rights, to innovate, in a context which allowed their voice heard at European level. The proposals were focused on one of the following three main themes: living together and participation, citizens of Internet, and all different, all equal. The students were assisted in this work by their teachers and Ten proposals were shortlisted by a jury and further presented and put on open vote during the Children Forum. The winner was the school Célestin Freinet with a project entitled "La fête de la différence"- "The celebration of diversity", which receive the trophy of the Children's Forum in an atmosphere of full enthusiasm.
