Prosecuting acts of domestic violence out of public interest against the victim's wishes?



 Seriousness of the offence, nature of the victim's injuries, use of a weapon, planning



 Existing criminal record, the risk of reoffending, any past history of violence



 Any risk to their health and safety, any effects on the children, the existence of further threats after the attack



 The history and current relationship, the effects of pursuing prosecution against the victim's wishes
