The Institute - a unique initiative, initially founded by the three partners in 2004, the first-of-its-kind programme aimed at building and developing the capacity of young lawyers from Central and Eastern European and the Newly Independent States (CEE/NIS) for litigation on :

violence against women, reproductive rights, employment discrimination

is expanding in terms of issues covered and geographical areas.

- The programme implemented by the **Bulgarian Gender Research Foundation /BGRF/- Sofia,** in partnership with the **Center for Reproductive Rights /CRR/** and the **Network of East- West Women / NEWW/** is continuously attracting new partners- like ECPI- Romania, WG on Women and ESCR, the AHR from Minnesota, AIRE Centre.
- The Institute has already successfully completed four rounds: WHRTI 2004-2006, WHRTI 2007-2009, WHRTI 2009-2011 and WHRTI 2011-2013 and trained more than 80 lawyers. A Fifth round is currently under completion with a new group of 25 lawyers. Over 20 countries were represented up to now.

The WHRTI provided up to now:

- advanced and in-depth knowledge on women's human rights protection in the 3 thematic fields, with focus also on intersectionalities and gender stereotypes
- practical skills and development of strategic litigation through the use of regional fora as the ECtHR, also the Optional Protocol to CEDAW on VAW and RR
- Practical skills for using the EU standards and the case law of the Court of Justice of the European Union.

Alumnae of the Institute include over 80 lawyers from Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Georgia, Hungary, Ireland (observer), Latvia, Lithuania, Macedonia, Moldova, Poland, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Slovakia, Spain, Tajikistan, Turkey, Ukraine, and **Uzbekistan.** Currently- Slovenia is represented, and we have an observer from Zimbabwe.





- Examples of international litigation undertaken by fellows through the support of the BGRF and of the WHRTI: *V.K. v. Bulgaria, Jallow v. Bulgaria, V.P. P. v. Bulgaria, Carreno v. Spain*/ all under the OP CEDAW/. And also *D.J. v. Croatia, A. v. Croatia, R. R. v. Poland, Meirelles v. Bulgaria, C.Z. v. Bulgaria,* before the ECtHR in Strasbourg.
- We propose our cooperation under the WHRTI as a *sui generis acquis* in the field of capacity building for access to justice for women.

Networking and Alliance building

- Establishing the Alliance for Protection against Gender-Based violence - the first registered union of women's NGOs in Bulgaria, in existence since 2009
- The Alliance established in 2011 the Academy for Prevention of Violence- a training institution for professionals dealing with VAW and violence against children
- Importance of initiatives of civil society and of international partnerships for education and capacity building, linking with advocacy
- Linking educational initiatives of CSO with universities
