## **Integrating the Issues of Cybercrime and Electronic Evidence into Judicial Training Curricula**

### **International Workshop**

**Johannesburg, South Africa, 11-13 April 2016**

Given the threat of cybercrime and the increasing relevance of electronic evidence in criminal proceedings, it is essential that all judges and prosecutors have the necessary skills with regard to these matters. The international workshop is aimed to support the integration of these topics into the curricula of judicial training institutions.

By the end of the workshop, participants are expected to adopt a report on the current state of judicial training on cybercrime and electronic evidence and the way forward to ensure the long-term integration of these topics into the curricula of judicial training academies in each GLACY country (Mauritius, Morocco, Philippines, South Africa, Senegal, Sri Lanka and Tonga);

Participants comprise representatives of judicial training institutions and trainers from each of the GLACY countries.

The event is held in Johannesburg and it is jointly organized by the South African Judicial Education Institute and the Council of Europe. It is part of the joint European Union/Council of Europe project on Global Action on Cybercrime (GLACY), 2013-2016.

The opening session in the morning of Monday, 11 April 2016, 9h00 – 9h45 will be open to media. A Press Briefing will follow from 9h45 to 10h15.
