#### Introduction

At the 6th Conference of Ministers responsible for cultural heritage (Namur, 23-24 April 2015), the Ministers adopted the Namur Declaration and the Namur Call.

The Ministers affirmed that cultural heritage is a key component of the European identity; it is of general public interest and its transmission to future generations is a shared responsibility; it is a unique resource, fragile, non-renewable and non-relocatable, contributing to the attractiveness and the development of Europe and, crucially, to the creation of a more peaceful, just and cohesive society.

The Ministers also expressed their alarm at the increasing number of acts of deliberate destruction of cultural heritage in the context of conflicts all over the world.

In the light of recent events in Syria and Iraq, the Council of Europe is currently examining the possibility of revising the "European Convention on Offences relating to Cultural Property," (ETS 119, also known as the Delphi Convention) which was drawn up in 1985. The Directorate General of Human Rights and Rule of Law, through its European Committee on Crime Problems (CDPC) which was at the time responsible for the drawing up of ETS 119, will present the proposal to revise the Delphi Convention to the Committee of Ministers before the end of 2015. If the Ministers' Deputies endorse the CDPC's proposal, work could start in early 2016. In this context, experts from the heritage and culture sector would be involved in the activities.

As regards the destruction of heritage, the Secretariat has prepared, as requested by the CDCCP, a list of relevant declarations and international conventions. The aim is to take stock of the existing texts in view of a possible initiative by a member States in line with the Namur Call.

#### **Action**

The Bureau is invited to take note of the information provided in the Appendix and of any additional information that delegations may wish to provide. It might possibly recommend that an assessment of these conventions and declarations is made (by a consultant) with a view to identifying possible gaps or lacunae which might justify action.
