- detention in captivity


very few restrictions on periods, areas and methods

- list of huntable species (35)
- list of admitted means (only firearms)

The repression of IKB in Italy

- National Forestry Corp (CFS Corpo Ferestale dello Stato, 7000 police officers in 2015)
 Antipoaching Unit (NOA Nucleo Operativo Antibracconaggio)
- District Police Corps (110 Districts, 2500 police officers in 2015)
- Voluntary Rangers (15,000 rangers in 2007)











MATTM is promoting activities to tackle IKB in Italy

- a national action plan
 - drafted in 2015
 - currently circulating among stakeholders
 - to be discussed in a technical workshop in May 2016
 - to be approved within December 2016

- <u>a public conference</u> involving all main actors and stakeholders
 - to be held in a black spot (Po Delta) in 2016






In this framework ISPRA was committed to update information on:

Main illegal activities and target species



- catching songbirds
- nest poaching songbirds, raptors
- illegal shooting raptors, game species, songbirds
- poisoning raptors
- trade (illegal import) gamebirds, songbirds, raptors





Main drivers

<u>catching of songbirds:</u> commercial purposes (traditional gourmet cuisine, use as live decoys)

taking from nests of songbirds and raptors: commercial purposes (use as live decoys, ornamental purposes or falconry)

illegal shooting of raptors, game species, songbirds: local traditions, vandalism, taxidermy poisoning of raptors: predator control (baits for carnivores)

illegal import of gamebirds, songbirds and raptors: commercial purposes


