Participatory Democracy Incubator

Citizens Forum, Portugal

Following his participation in the World Forum for Democracy 2015, Manuel Arriaga, visiting Research Professor at New York University, launched in Portugal an initiative called Citizens' Forum. Its aim is to engage citizens in improving democratic institutions, and to restore the public's trust in political leaders. It will bring together periodically a demographically representative panel of Portuguese citizens, who will learn how political institutions function, gather public and expert input, and deliberate on how democratic representation could be improved. Their recommendations will be shared in an open debate with political and executive decision-makers.

Citizens Jury, Ghent, Belgium

The World Forum for Democracy 2015 hosted a Hackathon, a creativity workshop, which gathered an eclectic mixture of visionary people representing local elected representatives, civil servants, founders of innovative participatory platforms and projects, experts in the field of innovation and social change. They have designed innovative prototypes and solutions for the Council of **Europe Participatory Democracy** Incubator.

Inspired by the Hackathon, the city of Ghent is going to organise a citizens' jury, to involve its communities in the decisionmaking process on new traffic regulation in the context of spatial policy plan for 2030. Citizens can also express their ideas via an online platform www.ruimtevoor.gent.

Upgrading Democracy, France



In April 2016, the French think tank Renaissance Numérique published a White Paper titled "Démocratie: mise à jour" (Upgrading Democracy). The report demonstrates how digital tools allow a new paradigm of governance for states and democratic systems. It identifies proposals to upgrade the public and democratic "software" towards more transparency, efficiency, participation and representativeness. The report has several references to the initiatives presented in the World Forum for Democracy, including the Hackathon.

Index for Participatory Democracy in Cities

An Index for Participatory Democracy in Cities has been developed in the context of the Participatory Democracy Incubator. The Index serves as a tool of self-assessment for cities, to critically evaluate and improve their structures for citizens' participation. The Index is based on a questionnaire related to the Index indicators, including: commitment, regulatory and policy framework, advisory boards and commissions, civic associations, range of issues, range of tactics, grassroots problem-solving, young people, transparency, monitoring and evaluation.
