The aims of the project

- Strengthening of institutional capacities aimed at fighting and preventing corruption in the public sector through policy support and specialised knowledge and skills development programs;
- Strengthened training capacities of the Commission for Combating Corruption and the Civil Service Commission:
- Reinforced law enforcement capacities of the Anti-Corruption Department of the General Prosecutor:
- Support the preparation of the new National Anti-Corruption Action Plan; and
- Anti-Corruption training is introduced into the public service and the education sector.

How will the project work?

Through tailored made actions on prevention, enforcement, and strategic development aimed at achieving each of the stated Project aims;

Project activities

- Development of the anti-corruption and ethics training curricula and set of trainers for the Commission for Combating Corruption and the Civil Service Commission;
- Specialised training courses for criminal justice authorities on topics including corporate criminal liability, international cooperation in economic crime investigations, and money laundering and terrorist financing investigations.
- ► Facilitating public discussion on the National Anti-Corruption Action Plan (2016 – 2019), expert advice, and development of an implementation monitoring tool;
- Development of an anti-corruption and ethics course for universities and public service training centres.
