## Higher education in the Benelux

- 5 higher education systems (3 Communities of Belgium + Netherlands + Luxembourg)
- Partial bilateral recognition agreements:
- Consitutionally guaranteed omnivalence of degrees of 3 Communities in Belgium (automatic)
- Between Netherlands and Flemish Community of Belgium (automatic) for Bachelor and Master
- Quasi automatic recognition in Luxembourg for officially recognised degrees from EU countries

### **BENELUX Decision: general scope**

- 1. Can be summarised in its full name:

  Benelux Decision "Germain Dondelinger" —

  Decision of Ministers on the mutual automatic generic recognition of the level of higher education degrees

  M (205) 3 of 18 May 2015
- 2. No spectacular change in comparision with current situation but political expression and legal anchoring of TRUST in each others' HE system and QA mechanisms underpinning them
- 3. First regional initiative of automatic recognition in EHEA

#### **Detailed content of the Decision**

- 1. Name: tribute to late CDPPE Chair
- 2. Decision: legal instrument to be incorporated in national legislation automatic recognition as legal right to citizen (jurisdiction of national Courts of Justice in case of complaints)
- 3. Mutual recognition: between all 5 HE systems
- 4. Generic (<-> specific): only level of the (officially recognised) degree (Bachelor and Master)
- 5. Academic (<-> professional): EU Directives on regulated professions out of scope

# Further steps towards genuine BENELUX Higher Education Area

- Transposition of BENELUX Decision in national legislation
- Specific recognition is still subject to procedural recognition (unless subject to EU directive for regulated professions), further steps for automatic recognition can be taken for certain *disciplines*
- Ph.D. and short cycle degrees not yet included
- Cooperation between NARICs and QA bodies to evolve towards stronger convergence and mutual acceptance of each others' decisions
- Fair recognition in procedural context is still necessary.
- ⇒BENELUX Decision cannot directly replace LRC!
