REPORT

59th meeting

Strasbourg, 7-10 March 2006

- 1. The Committee of Experts for the Improvement of Procedures for the Protection of Human Rights (DH-PR) held its 59th meeting in Strasbourg, on 7-10 March 2006. The meeting was chaired by Ms Ingrid SIESS-SCHERZ (Austria). The list of participants appears in <u>Appendix I</u>. The agenda, as adopted, appears in <u>Appendix II</u>.
- 2. The meeting was devoted to the preparation of the draft Activity Report Reform of the European Convention on Human Rights Declaration of the Committee of Ministers "Ensuring the effectiveness of the implementation of the European Convention on Human Rights at national and European levels" (document DH-PR(2006)002), which will be submitted to the CDDH for examination and adoption at its 62nd meeting (Strasbourg, 4 7 April 2006).
- 3. To this end, the DH-PR carried out a detailed examination of the work done by its working groups A and B during the seven meetings they had held since the previous meeting of the DH-PR. On the basis of the draft texts submitted by these two working groups, the DH-PR prepared:
- a. draft amending proposals that the CDDH could submit concerning the Rules of the Committee of Ministers for the supervision of the execution of judgments and of the terms of friendly settlements (document DH-PR(2006)002, Appendix III);
- b. a series of practical suggestions that the CDDH could submit to the Committee of Ministers to address situations of slow or negligent execution of judgments of the European Court of Human Rights (document DH-PR(2006)002, <u>Appendix IV</u>);
- c. a series of conclusions and suggestions that the CDDH could submit to the Committee of Ministers with regard to the implementation of the five recommendations mentioned in the Declaration "Ensuring the effectiveness of the implementation of the European Convention on Human Rights at national and European levels", adopted by the Committee of Ministers at its 114th session (12-13 May 2004) (document DH-PR(2006)002).

Comments on sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c)

- 4. Sub-paragraph (a):
- A detailed discussion took place in response to the CDDH's request that consideration be given to how to involve representatives of civil society in the process of supervising the execution of the Court's judgments. The orientation provided by the CDDH was interpreted differently by experts of the DH-PR. The question was, in particular, whether or not representatives of civil society should be allowed to submit communications to the Committee of Ministers concerning all aspects of the execution of judgments. Views within the DH-PR differed, but there was a majority in favor of allowing them to do so (see draft Rule 9).

- One expert was of the view that notably in the light of discussions within the Group of Specialists on access to official documents (DH-S-AC), it would be more appropriate, in letters (a) and (b) of paragraph 2 of proposed draft Rule 8, to only refer to "documents" and to delete reference to "information". The majority nonetheless preferred the sub paragraphs to be worded more broadly and cover both "information and documents relating thereto". The latter approach was thus adopted (see draft Rule 8).
- 5. With regard to sub-paragraph (b), the DH-PR considered that the practical suggestions it had submitted were mainly preventive ones, since most of the members of Working Group A did not have the experience to tackle other aspects in detail. The DH-PR considered that the Deputies could resume the examination of the issue.
- 6. With regard to sub-paragraph (c), the DH-PR stressed that, at this stage, the conclusions and suggestions were based solely on information provided by Governments. It held a detailed discussion on follow-up, after the May 2006 Ministerial Session, of the review of the implementation of the five recommendations. Opinions were divided as to the appropriateness of including among the general suggestions from the CDDH to the Committee of Ministers, one which would explicitly invite it to call for comments on the implementation of the recommendations from representatives of civil society, the national institutions for the promotion and the protection of human rights and Council of Europe bodies. At the end of this discussion, a majority agreed on including a compromise text to that effect among the general suggestions to be submitted to the Committee of Ministers (see the first indent of paragraph 35 of document DH-PR(2006)002).

- 7. In submitting its draft Activity Report (document DH-PR(2006)002) to the CDDH, the DH-PR considered that it had completed the terms of reference assigned to it.
