Subject : European flag.

A rough tabulation of the 33 first answers gives the following results:

3 Representatives have refused to make any choice;

10 indicated one flag;

1 indicated two flags;

4 indicated three flags;

indicated four flags;

2 indicated five lags;

and 10 Representatives gave twelve answers, as originally requested.

Coming far ahead among the flags indicated as the first one is N° 1. (blue with yellow sun - Coudenhove-Kalergi's - it was put sixteen times as the first one).

N° 7. is five times given as first one, and six times as second one. This is the main impression given.

I must make some remarks: Mr Hopkinson considers all of them as "unsuitable". He thinks that the cross cannot be used for an organization which includes Moslems.

The same argument is put forward by M. Urgüplü.

No 11. The red flag with EUROPA, the sun and the hand, is indicated by M. Reynaud but he wants it without the hand.

N° 10. is indicated with "if simplified with one E only, appearing in the second place.

If N° 7. is mentioned, it is with the supplementary remark; on the one hand, they should support the idea of its connection with the U.S.A. but on the other hand, if stars are used, too strong American impression should be avoided.

When N° 4. is mentioned, it is each time with the proposed suppression of the Strasbourg coat-of-arms.

Some of the Members have suggested to study the whole matter over again (two of them).
