# Identification of Roma Settlements/Organisations

# The Set of Criteria for the Identification of Potential Partner Roma Settlements/Organisations

We prepared the criteria for the identification of potential partner Roma settlements/organisations by bearing in mind minimum conditions for the adoption of the Kamenci development model.

The criteria consist of the following 6 sets:

#### 1. Interest for cooperation in the project

In line with this criterion, we checked if an organisation that received our sent questionnaire is interested in cooperation in the Council of Europe project: "Cultural resources for Roma inclusion". We also examined possibilities for active participation of the target Roma settlement in the project and probability for setting up a local Roma development partnership.

We are of the opinion that this is one of the key prerequisites for successful ("bottom up") planning of the development of the target Roma settlement/community.

#### 2. Organization skills and management

The second criterion pertains to the organisation's objectives and activities as well as its HR, financial and material potentials (facilities and equipment).

#### 3. Project experience

In line with this criterion, we assessed the organisation's project experience and its specific experience in working with the Roma population (projects/programmes/actions).

#### 4. Size of the target Roma settlement and infrastructure

As the Kamenci development model is best suited for smaller Roma settlements (with a population of up to 500), the adequacy of the target Roma settlement was also assessed by considering the size criterion. As a part of this criterion, we also assessed infrastructure conditions in the target Roma settlement. If a Roma settlement is to develop as an intercultural centre, it is desirable that the settlement has at least basic municipal infrastructure equipment and organised garbage removal.

#### 5. Safety in the target Roma settlement

Visitor safety is also one of the key prerequisites for the development of a Roma settlement as an intercultural centre. Hence, we also observed this criterion when assessing the adequacy of the settlement.

#### 6. Cultural potential of the target Roma settlement

Cultural potentials of the target Roma settlement was assessed by considering the following three criteria:

- Roma cultural heritage
- Roma living culture and creativity
- Integration of Roma culture in a cultural offer of the local community.

The assessment for the identification of 6-8 potential Roma partner settlements/organisations was conducted on the basis of the answers in the questionnaires that we e-mailed to the organisations. A sample questionnaire (and accompanying documents: project summary and short summary of the Kamenci development model) are included in the annex of this document. The criteria for the identification of potential partner Roma settlements/organisations are shown in the next table.

The organisations that received our questionnaires were selected on the basis of:

- Internet data (e.g. websites: <a href="http://www.erionet.eu/network-members.htm">http://www.erionet.eu/network-members.htm</a>);
- recommendations from organisations and individuals;
- studies on good practice examples.

When selecting a geographical area, we considered a contractual provision stipulating that the research should include 75 % of organisations from the area of the Eastern and Central Europe.

The questionnaires were e-mailed to 30 organisations from the following countries:

- 1. Austria (2 organisations did not respond to the invitation);
- Bosnia and Herzegovina (5 organisations 4 expressed its interest for cooperation, 1 organisation did not respond to the invitation);
- 3. Bulgaria (1 organisation did not respond to the invitation);
- 4. Croatia (4 organisations 2 expressed its interest for cooperation, 2 organisations did not respond to the invitation);
- 5. FYROM (5 organisations 4 expressed its interest for cooperation, 1 organisation did not respond to the invitation);
- 6. Hungary (2 organisations 2 expressed its interest for cooperation);
- 7. Italy (1 organisation expressed its interest for cooperation);
- 8. Kosovo (2 organisations both expressed its interest for cooperation);
- 9. Lithuania (1 organisation expressed its interest for cooperation);
- 10. Montenegro (2 organisations did not respond to the invitation);
- Serbia (3 organisations 1 expressed its interest for cooperation, 2 organisations did not respond to the invitation);
- 12. Slovakia (1 organisation did not respond to the invitation);
- 13. United Kingdom (1 organisation expressed its interest for cooperation).

In total, 18 organisations expressed its interest for cooperation.

As it is visible from the previous overview, we received the best response rate with the Western Balkans countries.

The completed questionnaires we received form the organisations expressing its interest for cooperation were assessed in accordance with the previously presented criteria for the identification of 6-8 Roma settlements /organisations.

Based on the score, we selected 8 Roma settlements/organisations for which we propose that we visit them and verify the accuracy of their assertions in the questionnaire on the spot.

The list of 8 identified Roma settlements/organisations is presented in a table in the following sections of the material.

We also include the list of all organisations which expressed their interest for cooperation (with short descriptions, evaluation sheets, our opinion and proposals).

#### **Explanation of assessment:**

- The criterion for the assessment of financial viability of Roma NGOs from different countries was used rather flexibly. It is commonly known that Roma NGOs are not capable of managing financially costly and complex projects. Having said that, we also awarded points for financial viability to those Roma NGOs whose answers in the questionnaire reveal that they have been continuously implementing projects over the past years and employing staff. We are namely of the opinion that if these organisations (considering their references and experience in working with the Roma population) are selected, they will be capable of acting as coordinators of activities within a local Roma development partnership and as animators of the target Roma population for participation in project activities. Financially costly and complex projects should in any case be implemented in the framework of a local Roma development partnership, whereby the home municipality should also participate as an investor (and owner of infrastructure facilities).
- Given the fact that organisations from FYROM expressed their enormous interest for project cooperation and that as many as four renowned Roma organisations (boasting extensive references) participated in the selection procedure, we also included 2 Roma settlements from FYROM (although these are bigger settlements with a population of over 500 and only partially provided infrastructure) based on high scores in accordance with other criteria. These two settlements, however, should have an enormous cultural development potential and competent Roma NGOs for its activation. We therefore propose that we also visit two Roma organisations and settlements (Kumanovo and Tetovo) to assess actual conditions on the spot and based on the visit estimate if it was at all possible to implement the Kamenci development model in any of these two settlements.

#### 2. SHORT PRESENTATION OF AN ORGANISATION/ROMA SETTLEMENT

#### NGO "JAČANJE – ZURALIPE" VITEZ:

This is a Roma NGO with the head office in Vitez, Bosnia and Herzegovina.

We contacted the NGO following a recommendation from the Sarajevo NGO Budi moj prijatelj (Be My Friend).

It is an assertive organisation which expressed its interest for project participation.

The organisation has partners at the local, regional and national level. It also cooperates with local administration authorities.

It has clearly defined objectives and activities; 3 employees and volunteers; its activities are supported by the OSF, the US Embassy in BIH and state authorities of Bosnia and Herzegovina; it also has appropriate premises and equipment at its disposal. The NGO also own business premises covering an area of 400 sq. m.

The organisation has project experience as well as direct experience in working with the Roma population.

The organisation proposed that the project is implemented in the Roma settlement Sofa in the municipality of Vitez. This is an independent Roma settlement with a population of 476. Infrastructure is only partially provided. The members of the majority population already visit the settlement. The security situation in the settlement is said to be good.

The settlement intentionally preserves Roma culture and heritage that is orally passed on from one generation to the next. They also refer to the existence of "living Roma culture". Roma culture also represents an integral part of cultural life in the home municipality.

#### 4. OPINION

- The organisation has clearly defined objectives, project experience and staff. It also has appropriate premises and equipment at its disposal.
- The organisation cooperates with the local community and partners at the local,
   regional and national level.
- The proposed Roma settlement (Sofa in the municipality of Vitez with a population of 476) is otherwise appropriate for the transfer of the Kamenci development model; however only partially provided municipal infrastructure might prove to be a barrier.
- Described cultural heritage and modern Roma cultural practices are interesting,
   suggesting that there are cultural potentials for social integration of Roma community members.

#### 5. PROPOSAL:

We propose a visit to the organisation NGO "JAČANJE – ZURALIPE" VITEZ, its partners and the proposed Roma settlement at Sofa in the municipality of Vitez as potential candidates for participation in the Council of Europe project.

#### **UDRUŽENJE ROMA OPŠTINE PRIJEDOR:**

This is a Roma NGO with the head office in Prijedor, Bosnia and Herzegovina.

The NGO was contacted following a recommendation from the Sarajevo NGO Budi moj prijatelj (Be My Friend).

The organisation expressed its interest for project participation. It has clearly defined objectives and activities; it does not have any employees; its financial viability is poor.

The organisation has already cooperated with the local community and other organisations at the local, regional and national level.

The organisation has project experience, notably working on small projects, and direct experience in working with the Roma population.

The organisation proposed that the project is implemented in the Roma settlement at Urije, a Roma district "mahala" with a Roma population of 80. Infrastructure in the settlement is provided. The members of the majority population already visit the settlement. Security in the settlement is said to be good.

The target Roma settlement preserves Roma culture and heritage that is orally passed on from one generation to the next. The settlement has a folklore group. The organisation did not list any modern Roma cultural practices in the questionnaire; however, Roma culture represents an integral part of a cultural offer in the municipality of Prijedor and is presented at different public events.

- The proposed Roma settlement at Urije, a Roma district "mahala" with a population of 80 is appropriate for the transfer of the Kamenci development model; municipal infrastructure in the settlement is said to be adequate. The members of the majority population already visit the settlement. Security situation in the settlement is said to be appropriate.
- The settlement has preserved Roma cultural heritage with some elements of Roma "living culture", which represents an integral part of a cultural offer in the local community. The settlement has culture development potentials for social integration of Roma community members in the field of culture and culture tourism.

This is a youth Roma NGO with the head office in Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina.

We contacted the NGO following a recommendation from the Sarajevo NGO Budi moj prijatelj (Be My Friend).

The organisation expressed its interest for project participation. It has partners at the local and regional level (Roma NGOs). It also cooperates with local administration authorities that fund its activities.

It has clearly defined objectives and activities; it does not have any employees; the organisation's financial viability is poor; but it has equipped office premises at its disposal.

The organisation has some project experience (managing small projects, probably one-off actions) and direct experience in working with the Roma population.

It is proposed that the project is implemented in the Roma settlement Malta, a Roma district "mahala"in Sarajevo with 20 Roma families. Infrastructure in the settlement is provided only partially. The members of the majority population already visit the settlement. Security situation in the settlement is said to be good.

The settlement intentionally preserves Roma culture and heritage that is passed on orally from one generation to the next. They also refer to the existence of modern Roma cultural practices. Roma culture also represents an integral part of cultural life in the home municipality.

#### **OPĆINA OREHOVICA - MUNICIPALITY OF OREHOVICA:**

This is a local community – municipality on the territory of the Medžimurje County in Croatia. The area of the Medžimurje County has the largest population of the Croatian Roma.

There are about 560 Roma living in the administrative area of the settlement Orehovica. The Roma populate hamlets that are in terms of its location separated from the major part of the settlement. The biggest and at the same time also the farthest hamlet is located by the Drava River within striking distance of the hydropower plant "Čakovec". It has a population of about 450. The second hamlet that that is closest to Orehovica has a population of 60, while the third hamlet, the so-called Celje, has a Roma population of about 50. The hamlet does not have only Roma population. The Roma who live here are mixed with the members of the majority population. The municipality of Orehovica strives for the development of Roma communities living on its territory and for their social integration. In doing so, it significantly differs from other Međimurje municipalities, which are often characterised by conflicts with the majority population, segregation of Roma children in schools and even grave violations of human rights (numerous cases at the European Court of Human Rights).

The municipality of Orehovica has an adequate financial and HR potential for the participation in the Council of Europe project. Moreover, it has elaborated spatial plans for Roma settlement planning and engineering. It has also established partnerships at the local, regional, national and cross-border level.

It is proposed that the biggest Roma settlement in Orehovica that is situated near the Drava River and has a population of about 450 participates in the Council of Europe project. The settlement has basic infrastructure. An event tent accommodating about 800 people was purchased. The tent can serve as the venue for intercultural events and other intercultural practices. The target Roma settlement preserves Roma heritage (cultural potentials of the Roma settlement are evaluated) and modern cultural practices are being introduced. Roma cultural offer represents an integral part of a cultural offer in the local community.

- There are Roma cultural potentials in the proposed settlement as the organisation also strives for the preservation of Roma cultural heritage; however, Roma culture does not represent an integral part of a cultural offer in the local community.
- Based on the answers provided in the questionnaire, we conclude that it would be difficult to implement the Kamenci development model in the settlement Vasvár due to professional and financial weaknesses of the proponent as well as due to possible barriers standing in the way of the establishment of the local development partnership.

It is said that safety to visitors is not provided (quote): The social status of Roma people it is considered as a poor, they don't have enough information for their rights and opportunities. Roma population manly live in poor conditions, no homes, in many places in containers with no condition such as electricity, clean water, toilets, etc. The main problem we think that those people should prepare their self to follow the schools, which the first big step for their future and also for the majority to employ them. Also the average of life is to short, based on last information around 40 years.

Last decade with engagement of different NGO and Municipality departments there are some small movements, but still there is a huge need to do more and more. They keep with fanaticism their culture and tradition especially in cases with early marriage (unquote).

This is a Roma NGO with the head office in Kikinda – Vojvodina - Serbia.

The organisation expressed its interest for project participation. It has clearly defined objectives and activities as well as adequate premises for project implementation. It does not employ any staff. The municipality provided premises for the Roma culture and education centre (the facility is in need of adaptation).

The organisation established partnerships at the local, regional, national and international level. It also has project experience in working on small projects.

It proposes that the project is implemented in the Roma settlement Mali Bedem in the municipality of Kikinda (230 inhabitants). The NGO points to low social and economic status of the Roma population (poverty). The settlement is not urbanised (absence of municipal infrastructure, poor housing standard of the Roma). As a rule, Non-Roma individuals do not come to the settlement.

The organisation endeavours for the preservation of Roma cultural practices and Roma identity. The settlement has a Roma band and folklore group. It also organises public events (particularly on the occasion of the Roma Day). These events are also co-financed by the home municipality.

- Yet we think that prior to this, the settlement will have to be urbanised as it lacks basic municipal infrastructure. Moreover, according to the NGO housing standard of the Roma population is said to be extremely low.
- Yet it is hard to give a relevant opinion on the subject without the examination of the conditions on the spot.

### 2. SHORT PRESENTATION OF AN ORGANISATION/ROMA SETTLEMENT

### **ROMU VISUOMENES CENTRAS – ROMA COMMUNITY CENTRE:**

The organisation works with Roma community as a public centre, providing space for the past-time of the children and young people as well as for the professional development of adults. The organisation expressed its interest for participation in the Council of Europe project.

The organisation has clearly defined objectives and activities; it employs 25 people and volunteers; it receives financial support from the Ministry of Culture of the Republic of Lithuania and also from the EU through projects. It has extensive project experience (also in working with the Roma population) and partners at the local, regional and national level. It also cooperates with local administration authorities. *The Roma community Centre has a building, situated in the Roma settlement in Kirtimai, outskirts of Vilnius. It is a one-floor building (as requested by the community) with two offices and two classrooms and a hall for the activities.* 

The organisation proposed that the project is implemented in the Roma settlement: Kirtimai (municipality: Vilnus). This is an independent Roma settlement with a population of about 450. Infrastructure in the settlement is only partially provided. The members of the majority population occasionally already visit the settlement. Safety in the settlement is said not to be the best.

The group of the Romani women, with the support of the "Intercultural Cities" programme of the Council of Europe and other organisations, during this summer advanced in rediscovering their creative potential and combining the old traditions, folklore stories, usage of colours etc., with the modern and newly acquired skill of embroidery, application, sewing techniques, as well as creating designs, based on Romani motives for T-shirts, bags and other souvenirs for sale.

### Cultural resources for Roma inclusion: Feasibility phase of a cultural enterprise project in Roma settlements

Project proposal by the Council of Europe

### **Background**

Policies for Roma inclusion have so far focused on fostering better opportunities for education, employment and improvement of welfare of Roma communities. Relatively little attention has been paid to the understanding of Roma culture within wider societies and for creating conditions for direct encounters and trust-building between Roma and non-Roma in the context of cultural activities. Cultural understanding and trust are however pre-conditions for effective and sustainable inclusion.

Cultural resources for Roma inclusion addresses both trust-building and understanding Roma culture and heritage. Due to the complexity of the project, it is supposed to organise work in three successive phases to allow for flexibility and adjustments along the way. Below is an outline of the feasibility phase of the project and in appendix information about the next phase, called "preparatory" which should be followed by an implementation phase subject to successful completion of phase 2 and the availability of required resources.

Our proposal is to associate three main funding partners: the Open Society Institute, the Council of Europe and the European Commission, with the Council of Europe carrying also the operational responsibility. Through this proposal, financial support is sought from OSI for the feasibility phase, with the CoE and the EC expected to provide resources for the preparatory phase. Search for resources for the implementation phase will begin after the feasibility phase with the European Social Fund and Norway Grants as possible sources.

#### **Objectives**

The project aims at working with 5 Roma settlements in Europe on the development of detailed business plans inspired by the successful experience of Roma settlement Kamenci<sup>1</sup> in North-Eastern Slovenia. Kamenci succeeded in creating a sustainable set of activities which enable non-Roma visitors to experience Roma culture and engage in a dialogue with the members of the Roma community.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In Kamenci a series of cultural activities and resources have been developed by the Roma inhabitants with the help of facilitators and artists. These activities involve cultural workshops for non-Roma visitors such as herbs and gardening, legends, music and poetry, photography workshops for children, summer camps for a mix of Roma and non-Roma children, a museum of Roma heritage and a cultural events centre. The activities have been established on a more or less permanent basis, attracting over 5000 visitors a year, providing sustainable income for families, recognition of Roma culture and empowerment of Roma inhabitants as decision-makers and managers of their activity. The results in terms of community cohesion, organisation and stability and improvement of working conditions for families are impressive. The artistic workshops and activities provide a positive environment for encounters and dialogue between Roma and non-Roma. Several EU-funded projects have been carried out in Kamenci – as a result, the infrastructure of the settlement and the livelihood of the people were greatly improved.

# THE ROMA SETTLEMENT KAMENCI<sup>2</sup> »SOROTIJME - JUNCTURE«

The northeasternmost part of Slovenia, Prekmurje, is characterized by a "living laboratory of minorities" because apart from Slovenians different ethnic communities, including Roma, live there.

Members of this community also reside in the Roma settlement Kamenci, located in the Črenšovci municipality near the main roads between the towns of Lendava and Murska Sobota. There are 127 people living in Kamenci, of which there are about 50 children, which represents about 40 percent of the population of this village.

https://wcd.coe.int/ Dr Robin Oakley: **The situation of Roma** in Europe: a challenge for local and regional authorities - (b) Promoting Roma Empowerment and Participation: **The Roma settlement of Kamenci**, in the municipality of Črenšovci in Slovenia, has been the base for a wide range of cultural initiatives, as well as successfully addressing issues around school participation, housing and employment. Many Roma traditions have been revived, such as housing styles, music and dance, and traditional crafts. A Roma museum has also been established, all this resulting in the area becoming a local tourist attraction, thus contributing positively to the local economic situation. The settlement's association and the municipality recently jointly hosted the launch of the CoE's 'European Route of Roma Culture and Heritage', which will bring together a wide range of municipalities, Roma bodies and other agencies involved in the preservation and promotion of Roma culture. While their primary goals are educational, such cultural activities can also bring economic benefit for municipalities that sponsor them and for Roma who participate in them.

Kamenci is not only one of the Roma settlements, but it is also important for its events, efforts and activities that take place in this village. Kamenci represents a unique position in this region and beyond. The Roma settlement Kamenci is a true "SOROTIJME" (in the Roma language) or "JUNCTURE" (in translation) - this is a place, where the past and the present meet. It represents a development potential for a brighter and richer future, and it is a place for meeting people of different nationalities, professions, cultures and creative ideas.



The Roma settlement Kamenci is known for its **planned preservation of Roma cultural heritage** that is still marked by a kind of struggle for recognition in order to be identified as part of the European cultural heritage that was more or less overlooked in the past.

In 2003, the first **museum of Roma** in Slovenia was opened in Kamenci. It is part of the efforts of the Roma community from Kamenci to preserve the historical memory of the Roma. The museum exhibits items from the period when the first Roma family settled in the Kamenci area. In and around the museum visitors can see the old way of life of Roma. Participating in the demonstrations of traditional crafts of Roma ("grinders", fortune-tellers, musicians and dancers), museum visitors learn about the history of the Roma settlement Kamenci, legends, and other cultural practices that were passed down from generation to generation as part of their oral tradition. The most attractive museum item is the white violin about which there exists an interesting Roma legend telling the story about a violin that used to be black and then turned into a white one.



In 2006, the first Roma herbal garden in Slovenia was planted in Kamenci with the aim of preserving the rich traditions of the Roma folk medicine (herbalism). In the past, Roma women were known for their thorough knowledge of the effects of medicinal plants and folk healing, which is recognized among the Roma as well as the majority population.



In the Roma in the herbal garden in Kamenci there are **sculptures** made from scrap and designed by academic sculptors with the participation of Roma children and adolescents. Acting as assistants to the sculptors, these Roma youths actively participated in the creative design and creation of works of



The Roma from Kamenci have kept the tradition of producing **amulets**. Already present in prehistoric times (and still there today), these amulets are highly appreciated as a defense against spells and accidents. The purpose of these amulets made in Kamenci is to keep health and happiness as well as to repel spells. The inhabitants have also developed a **rich souvenir-making activity**, where they make a wide range of tourist souvenirs in the form of useful and decorative items.



Kamenci is not just a "SOROTIJME - JUNCTURE" with the past, but also with the future. **The future of Kamenci** is represented by its most important potential: **children and adolescents**.

The development of endogenous potentials of children and adolescents from Kamenci is permanently realized by the Roma development partnership carrying out educational and creative activities aimed at the young Roma population to provide more equal participation in education, employment and social processes in general.



Each year, the Roma settlement Kamenci Each hosts the now **traditional Roma summer camps**: interdisciplinary, creative workshops for the development of social skills, creativity and innate talents young Roma population.



The village also has a modern **Roma cultural and information center Rokic: "DROM**", symbolically opened at the celebration of the International Roma Day on April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2011 by the European Commissioner for Human Rights, Mr. Thomas Hammarberg<sup>3</sup>, and the Slovenian Human Rights Ombudsman, Dr. Zdenka Čebašek Travnik.

The center conducts cultural, educational and information activities for the Roma population and the visitors to Kamenci. It also houses a Roma educational incubator, in which members of the Roma academic club regularly provide learning support to pupils and students from Kamenci.

The Roma settlement Kamenci is also an intercultural "SOROTIJME - JUNCTURE."

The village has hosted diverse **intercultural events** for 10 years: musical performances, sculpture colonies, literary evenings, round tables, international conferences, book presentations, movie nights, educational and creative workshops and creative gatherings of the Roma community of artists (writers, sculptors, painters, photographers, filmmakers and others). In October 2009, Kamenci held the main event at the opening of the **European Route of Roma Culture and Heritage of the Council of Europe**<sup>4</sup>.









In Kamenci, people of different nationalities, cultures and occupations meet at various events, whether they be events celebrating the International Roma Day, literary evenings, round tables, film making, or just casually - tasting an excellent Roma coffee.

Its objective is to reduce barriers between Roma and non-Roma by presenting Roma cultures as a part of the mainstream cultures of societies, and not as something on the margins, and by providing opportunities for direct encounters between Roma and non-Roma. The Roma route has two different strands: one deals with Roma history and memory and involves primarilly museums. An application is being prepared by the partners for EU funding for a series of activities in 2010. The other strand, which represents the more innovative aspect of the Route, concerns the organisation by Roma communities and settlements of educational and cultural activities for the public - as it is done in Kamenci in Slovenia. We would like this experience to inspire others so that a network of such places for encounter emerges across Europe. The "cultural route" label, associated with a 20-year old programme of the Council of Europe, is simply a way of introducing the concept as a journey across time and space.
