Cybercrime Prevention Act of 2012

- Signed into law on 12 September 2012
- The law defines cybercrime offenses, such as those against the confidentiality, integrity and availability of computer data and systems, as well as computer-related and content-related offenses and provides for its penalties
- In accord with international standards and protocol of the Budapest Convention on Cybercrime
