SERVICES OFFERED BY THE EUROPEAN YOUTH CENTRE STRASBOURG

Completely renovated in 2008, the Centre offers the following services:

- accommodation for 90 people in single, double or triple rooms with individual shower and toilet,
- self-service restaurant (with standard offers or special services at request) for lunches, dinners and receptions,
- meeting rooms with capacities for 10 to 140 people, with simultaneous interpretation facilities and a wide range of digital audiovisual equipment and educational material,
- > 24-hour reception service, 7 days a week,
- ▶ free access to the cybercentre with high-speed Internet,
- access to Wi-Fi throughout the building,
- Information centre for research and documentation,
- ▶ large terrace where you may relax with a view of the European institutions,
- bicycles for hire,
- ► sauna,
- games area (including a piano and hi-fi),
- parking area.

The centre is accessible via public transport and is just 300m from the nearest tram stop.
