• The Constitution of Georgia - Article 35

'Everyone shall have the right to receive education and the right to free choice of a form of education'

- The Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Article 24
- The LAW OF GEORGIA ON GENERAL EDUCATION Article 33, point1, sub-point g 'A general education institution shall have the right to, create necessary conditions for inclusive education";
- The National Curriculum Chapter V 'Inclusive Education'

'Inclusive education means involving a student with special educational needs in the general education process alongside with his/her peers'










Number of Multidisciplinary Team Members








Number of SEN pupils in Boarding Schools







Education for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Students Since 2009



- Tow schools for deaf and hard of hearing;
- Schools were oriented to develop speech;
- Forbidden to use sign language;
- No Eccessable Vocational and High Education;



Deaf and Hard of Hearing Students Developing process



- Developing Georgian sign Language;
- Setting up new schedule for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Students;
- Developed learning materials;
- Developing sign Language dictionary;
- Created alternative Curriculum;
- Developed integrated class model for hard of hearing students;

- Developed text books on braille for all students;
- Developed additional learning material in Tactile;
- Implementing social programs for integration in Society;
- Alternative Curriculum;
- Alternative class for multiple disability students;
- appeared blind students in public schools;

 - ➤ Individual Education plans;




