- **Good governance**

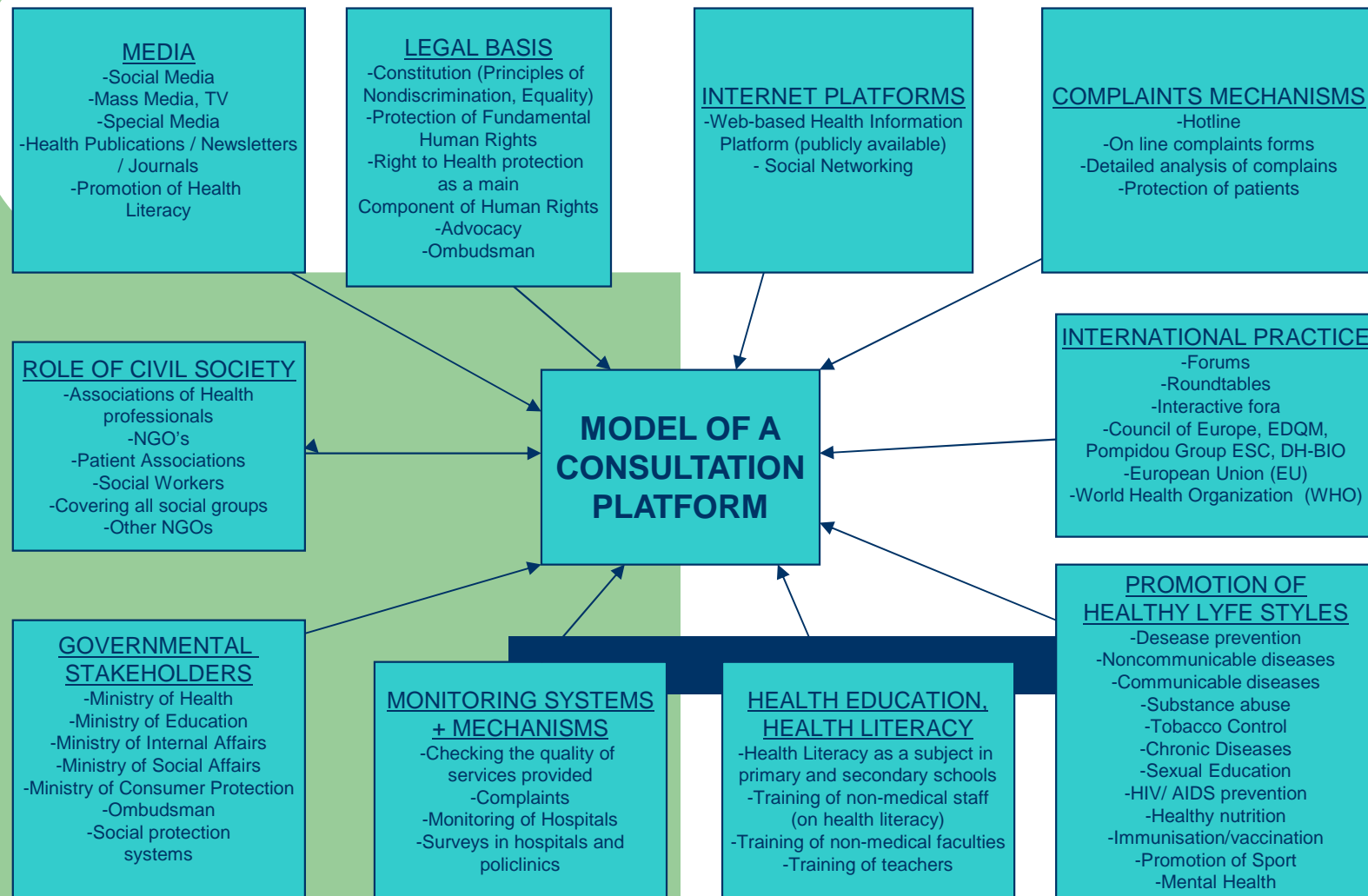
- Transparency not enough **CM/Rec(2010)6**
