#### I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF THE ACTION

The objective of the project is to promote good governance notably through increased prevention of corruption and money-laundering on the basis of the relevant Council of Europe standards, mechanisms and instruments and to improve the basic framework for regional co-operation in this respect.

The reporting period covers activities implemented from 1 January to 20 June 2014 based on an updated calendar of activities, which takes into consideration the current situation in Tunisia and the difficult cooperation with some beneficiaries in Morocco. A total of project 11 activities have been implemented during this period. For Morocco they included the finalization, presentation and publication of the Anti-corruption assessment using GRECO methodologies (M1.5, M1.6, M1.7), assistance in the drafting of internal rules of the ICPC (M2.1) and training on criminal investigation of corruption and economic crime offences (M4.5). For Tunisia these activities included assistance to the drafting of AC Law (T2.3), assistance in the drafting of internal rules of the INLUCC (T3.2), a Risks Assessment in the sector of public properties (T3.3), multidisciplinary training on financial investigations (T.4.2) as well as a a study visit to the Council of Europe Headquarters in Strasbourg, which served a number of different purposes: to acquaint Tunisian authorities with CoE standards on the fight against economic crime (Activity T1.1), raising awareness on international standards in the area of financing of political parties and non-profit organizations (T2.4) . As of June 2014, seventeen activities out of the thirty envisaged by the project workplan have been effectively delivered and closed. Another fourteen activities which cover the remainder of the SNAC Workplan, are being implemented and are set for completion in due time in the next two reporting periods.

In the implementation of the workplan, the Council of Europe has involved experts from 12 member states in order to provide broad range of European practices in various anticorruption issues. (Albania, Belgium, Croatia, France, Germany, Italy, Moldova, Portugal, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain, United Kingdom).

When possible, the Council of Europe has also involved Moroccan and Tunisian experts in order to develop local expertise on European AC standards.

#### 1. State of cooperation in Morocco

In the period under review the cooperation with Morocco was centred around the assessment of the national anti-corruption framework based on the GRECO methodology. The assessment has been instrumental in identifying systemic gaps and major priorities for further anti-corruption reforms in Morocco. The final assessment report contains a total of 66 Recommendations covering various aspects of the anti-corruption regime of Morocco. These results have also considerably facilitated the delivery of the technical assistance with regard to other activities implemented by SNAC, which have been adapted to better respond to the needs and gaps identified in the assessment. The ownership of technical assistance on the part of beneficiaries has also significantly increased. A major landmark for the activity has been the presentation of the AC assessment report to policymakers and the broader public organized on 20 February 2014 in Rabat.

The SNAC project team has experienced complications in the delivery of several important activities, such as the drafting of the national AC Strategy, which is under the remit of the Ministry of Public Administration. The main obstacle has been the difficulty to establish and maintain efficient communication with this agency.

#### 2. State of the cooperation in Tunisia

During the period under review cooperation activities further focused on strengthening of the Tunisian anti-corruption agency, *Institution nationale de lutte contre la corruption* and implementation of Council of Europe methodologies on Corruption Risks assessment.

Following the adoption of the new Constitution, the Instance is expected to be strengthened, particularly in its role to investigate cases of corruption and good governance. For its part the Council of Europe has assisted in designing the internal regulatory framework of the INLUCC. INLUCC has also requested the CoE to contribute to the preparation of the law on the new anti-corruption agency as stated in the Constitution.

An important interagency activity involving beneficiaries from public administration and the civil society took place on 12-13 June 2014 at the Council of Europe Headquarters in Strasbourg. Tunisian authorities were acquainted with the practices of various bodies of the Council of Europe, particularly the work of GRECO, MONEYVAL, PACE and the Venice Commission in the economic crime area. The meetings also included a presentation by Moroccan experts of the results achieved by SNAC in assessing the anti-corruption framework of Morocco using GRECO methodologies. At the request of the Tunisian authorities and as a means for preparation for future reforms, the Council of Europe presented its standards and methodologies on political party financing and the financing of non-profit organisations.

## II. SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES AND BENCHMARK FULFILLMENT (January –June 2014)

## 1. Summary of Expected Results for Morocco and Tunisia

**Objective:** Enhancing the political and democratic reform process in countries of the region.

**Specific Objective**: Promoting good governance notably through increased prevention of corruption and money-laundering on the basis of the relevant Council of Europe standards, mechanisms and instruments and to improve the basic framework for regional co-operation in this respect.

**Overall Result:** The main Council of Europe and European Union standards and best practices in terms of mechanisms and instruments to control and combat corruption, money-laundering and terrorism financing are introduced into the beneficiary policy framework and institutional setup. The relevant capacities of the judiciary and law-enforcement agencies are increased. The basic framework for regional co-operation is improved.

# **Expected Result I:** Recommendations and policy advice in the area good governance and fight against corruption are made available following <u>assessment of the</u>

anti-corruption's legal and institutional framework on basis of the GRECO methodology.

#### 2. State of the Cooperation

In the reported period, the cooperation with the coordinating institution in Morocco (ICPC) was successful and regular (on a weekly basis). The institution has provided support in the organisation of activities, partly in undertaking coordination of national authorities.

Beneficiaries demonstrate a high degree of ownership of Project activities, which was particularly manifested during the final event of the AC Diagnostic.

A significant difficulty in the implementation of activities related to the AC strategy is the lack of cooperation/communication from the Ministry of Public Administration (MPA). Despite repeated attempts by the CoE Secretariat and main counterpart (ICPC) to bring the MPA on board, efficient contact has not yet been established.

#### 2. State of the Cooperation

Due to political instability, implementation of activities suffered from continuous delays. Reluctance by the main counterpart institution to undertake any interagency facilitation has fully placed this task on the SNAC Project team, which has not yet experienced any difficulties in liaising with other agencies. The Ministry of Justice has been particularly helpful in gathering an interagency audience for the training seminar on criminal investigation techniques in economic crime and corruption.

## **V. COOPERATION WITH THIRD PARTIES**

Initiated during inception phase, a regular exchange of information was set-up with OECD and UNDP by telephone and email.

#### VI. COMPONENT ACHIEVEMENTS AND RISKS

#### 1. Achievements

The workplan is being implemented. Seventeen activities have been completed. 14 activities are underway. At this time, delays are manageable and the activities should be finalised by the end of the Programme (December 2014).

#### 2. Risks

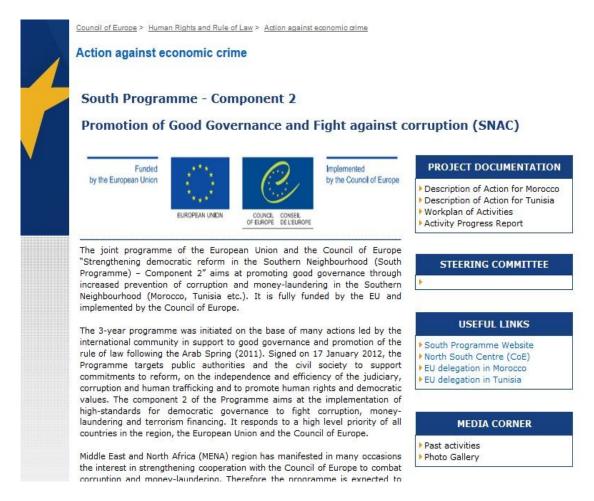
**Political instability** is a major risk in Tunisia. Workplan's implementation is complex and jeopardised. In addition the cooperation with the main counterpart institution was considerably reassessed during the reported period, due to the fact that the state secretariat of governance stepped-out from several activities to leave leadership to other stakeholders.

In Morocco, **cooperation with the Ministry of Public Administration** has proven difficult and sporadic cooperation has caused significant delays in the implementation of the workplan.

**Risk for the duplication of efforts with other international organisations** persists although routine exchange of information was set-up with OECD and UNDP in order to limit duplication of efforts. One specific example has been the duplication of training sessions on financial investigations with the UNDP in the Ministry of Justice in June 2014. The CoE Office in Tunis should reach out to partners as well as local counterparts to streamline and coordinate activities and exclude the risks of future duplication.

#### VII. COMPONENT VISIBILITY ACTIONS

Bilingual project website (English and French) has been set up under the CoE Economic Crime Cooperation Unit web page and is regularly updated with project news, upcoming events and outputs: (http://www.coe.int/snac). This website complements the general web portal setup by the Office of the Directorate General on Programmes (http://south-programme-eu.coe.int/).



Programme visibility is ensured through the inclusion of the project logo on the website and each project technical paper. For each activity, the logo of the Programme is screened and top-expos are used for each activity on the spot. In addition, visibility material such as document folders and notepads are being used and handed out at each activity.

The project will ensure the visibility of the EU's contribution at all stages of its activities. The CoE is taking all appropriate measures to publicise the fact that the project is being financed by the European Union. All reporting and information used and disseminated acknowledge that project activities have been "Funded by the European Union, implemented by the Council of Europe" by also displaying in an appropriate way the European Union logo.

In the period under review, the activities linked to the AC Diagnostic of Morocco enjoyed large media coverage.
