Outcome	<ul> <li>On 4 September 2012, MOLI Serbia project held its 4th Steering Committee meeting where the project team presented Project activities since January 2012 and planned activities until the end of the year. Some the key issues were identified by the SC in relation to Project implementation and management:         <ul> <li>It was agreed that Project activities and especially any legal review that takes place should take several new factors into consideration, such as the revised FATF recommendations which came out in February 2012 and 4th EU Directive on AML, which is expected to be published in October-November 2012. The results of the NRA process and new FATF standards should also be taken into consideration during this process.</li> <li>The Tools used for Project monitoring should be updated and upgraded to ensure that all information about past and planned activities is included in a single document as well as a delineation of responsibilities between stakeholders.</li> <li>All Project activities should be organized in observance of the Project Workplan, which could be also amended to accommodate emerging needs in accordance with the situation on the ground. This however, should be done in observance of the formal procedure through a request to EUD. If deemed necessary, it was suggested that the stakeholders should hold monthly meetings to discuss important issues, deliverables and amendments to the Workplan, before Steering Committee meetings take place.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Activity	Training session for APML staff members on the subject of New Payment Systems, 14 September 2012
Output Reference	3.1.4 Organise Training Events for APML staff in cooperation with other state agencies
Aim	To provide an overview of 'New Payment Methods and Technologies' and Experiences from EU Member States' to APML staff, and to engender discussion.
Outcome	On 14 September 2012, MOLI Serbia project organised a tailor-made training session for all staff members of the Administration for the Prevention of Money Laundering (APML) on the subject of New Payment Systems. The training was delivered by the project Long-Term Consultant and is one in a series of trainings specifically requested by the APML, as identified through a Training Needs Assessment carried out earlier this year.  Specific issues relating to the use and vulnerability of new payment methods in Serbia were discussed and in particular the need for awareness raising within the APML and law enforcement about the technological advances and use of such systems. There was also substantial agreement that cooperation on this issue between the APML, Intelligence Agencies, and Ministry of Interior was paramount, and a wider acknowledgment of the role and potential for further development of the role, of financial intelligence.
Follow-up	The project will continue to support the APML by providing further training

Activity	Practical Media training for two APML staff members, 27-28 September 2012
Output Reference	2.1.3 – Organise a training event for government public relations officers on adequate presentation of AML/CFT issues and activity reporting to the public and relevant institutions.
Aim	To ensure and enhance the visibility and transparency of the AML/CFT system and in particular that of APML through training of staff in media relations and in provision of information to the public.
Outcome	Mosaic BCA, selected by the MOLI Project to implement a series of public-relations activities/training on AML/CFT issues provided a theoretical and practical training on 27-28 September 2012 for two APML staff members, who have been appointed as the main spokespersons for APML (Mr Aleksandar Vujicic, Director, and Ms Milunka Milanovic, Head of Supervision Department). The theoretical 3-hour training focused on the following topics: Professional Communication; Public Speaking and Media Appearance; and Developing confidence and overcoming stage fright. The practical part of the training took place in a TV studio, where the trainees took part in a simulation of a TV appearance ("Hard Talk"-style interview). Both media trainers are recognised TV journalists. The trainees have also been provided with written guidelines and personal recommendations on how to behave in an interview situation.
Follow-up	The training component for APML staff, as set out in the media strategy, is now completed. Follow-up activities will focus on informing other state agencies and the wider public on AML/CFT issues.

Outcome	Mosaic BCA has delivered a Communication Strategy designed for the needs of
	APML, with the objective to reach the wider public and raise awareness on AML/CFT
	issues. The strategy outlines the objectives, the message and a timeline for executing
	media-related activities until the end of February 2013. The implementation of the
	strategy is split into four phases: Preparation stage; Initiation of Media Relations;
	Establishing institutional communication/cooperation; and further activities on media
	promotion.
Follow-up	Mosaic BCA will handle media relations of MOLI project workshop and organise a
	"Working Breakfast" meeting with journalists planned for October 2012.

#### PLANNED ACTIVITIES FOR THE NEXT PERIOD

- 2<sup>nd</sup> NRA Workshop will be held in Belgrade from 23-24 October 2012, the outcome of which will be the first draft NRA report. (Activity 2.3.1.)
- The first of three planned regional typologies meetings will take place on 25 October 2012 in Belgrade. Heads of regional FIUs are expected to attend the meeting. (Activity 6.1.1.)
- A conference on the application of Risk-Based Approach (RBA) for licensed accountants, auditors
  and other DNFBP professionals will take place on 30 October 2012 in Belgrade. (Activity 5.2.3.)
- MOLI Serbia has contracted Mr Herbert Laferla to carry out a comprehensive legal review during October/November 2012, in order to assess Serbia's compliance with international AML/CFT standards, particularly taking into account the new FATF recommendations and the forthcoming 4th EU Directive.(Activity 1.1.3)
- A research study into the risks of abuse of the NPOs for money laundering and terrorist financing purposes will start in October 2012. Mr Grahame Barker, CoE expert, will begin the research with a scoping mission to Serbia on 18-19 October 2012. (Activity 2.3.3)

## CONCLUSIONS

During the month of September 2012, MOLI Serbia activities mainly focused on delivering Activity 3.1.4. (APML training session on New Payment Systems) and Activity 2.1.3. (theoretical and practical media training for APML spokespersons). MOLI Serbia project continues without any major obstacles.
