Reykjavík

- Population: Around 120 thousand
- City councillors: 15 (will be 23 in 2018)
- Mayor elected by the City Council
- Committee on Governance and Democracy founded in 2014



Reykjavík's Policy of Information

Drafted by the Division of Communication

Passed through the Committee on Governance and Democracy

Ratified by the City Council in 2015

Main emphasis

- Open government transparency
- Easy access to information
- Increased operational efficiency
- All data behind decisions made available in minutes on City's website
- Financial data of operations published
- E-services expanded
- Open data made available

Trustworthy information

- Based on facts
- In accordance with law, ethics and human rights policy
- Updated and timely publishing
- Errors rectified
- Process of decision making open and traceable

User-centric design

- Extensive user testing
- Standards of accessibility
- Ease of search
- News about decisions published widely on web and social media to reach as many people as possible

Two-way communication

- City offers citizens ways to participate in democratic processes
- The City encourages communication through social media and other media
- The City ensures that opinions are heard
- The City answers all questions and errands with reliable information



My Neighbourhood

- Citizen participation project started in 2012
- Created by the Citizen's Foundation and adopted by the City of Reykjavík
- Online platform on the city website
- A slice of the city's development budget in each city neigbourhood managed by residents
- Record participation in 2016 9,4% of all city residents voted on their local budget

Phase 2 – review of ideas

- City staff review all ideas, filter out the unrealistic ones, those over budget, etc.
- Rough drafts are created and costs are estimated
- Top 25 ideas in each neighbourhood get passed to Phase 3



Phase 3 - voting

- Any resident can vote on the ideas proposed for their neighbourhood
- Each voter picks any number of ideas within the specificied budget
- Votes are tallied and the winning ideas go to Phase 4



Phase 4 - development

 The ideas voted for in Phase 3 are actualized
